


**EXHIBIT 2: TMK map depicting our property and the 'auwai intake point**









Robert,

I am getting back to you with additional information we received from the applicants regarding the Brito (2215/2216N), Haleakala (2236), and Mendoza (2256/2257N) SWUPAs. You had a question about this one because the LCA numbers were not identifiable from the TMK map. As I explained, the three parcels (TMK Nos 3-3-2:3, 25, and 29) were subdivided from a larger parcel, such that the LCA numbers do not appear on the current TMK map.

The 1st attachment below, "3-3-2-3 25 & 29," is a blow-up from the TMK map just to show the general location of the 3 parcels and what they look like in relation to each other.

The 2d attachment, labeled "Map No. 340," is a 1979 map that shows the land after TMK No. 25 was subdivided out and before the remaining parcel, TMK No. 3, was further subdivided into Lots 1 and 2, which became TMK Nos. 3 and 29. (The handwriting is mine, to show where parcel 25 is located.) According to the TMK map, the sizes of the three parcels are 12,682 sf, 10,811 sf, and 4,814 sf, for parcels 3, 29, and 25, respectively, which totals 28,307 sf, or 0.65 acres. That is the size of the land indicated on Map No. 340.

The 3rd attachment, labeled "Ord 1031," is a 1980 Maui County Ordinance changing the zoning for TMK parcel 3-3-2-3. It specifically refers to the TMK number and the parcel on "Map No. 340." The ordinance indicates that the parcel includes portions of LCA 3294B/RP 6102, LCA 3237, LCA 2553:1/RP 6259, and LCA 3387/RP6065 and a poalima. (As I suspected, and indicated in my 2/10 email, LCA No. 3488 was not part of this parcel.) The 4th attachment ("Parcel 3 subd"), which is unfortunately not a great copy, shows the subdivision of parcel 3 into Lots 1 and 2, which became TMK Nos. 3 and 29.

The last attachment is the surveyor's certification and the relevant portion of "Registered Map 1261," which shows all of the LCAs in the area. (The source sent only these portions because the map is large, but the entire map would probably be useful for you to get your hands on, as it spans the Central Maui area.) I have shaded in pencil the shape and location of the original parcel, but it is obviously not exactly to scale. Both maps include Puuohala Road, and the TMK map also retains some contours of the LCAs, so you can match them together. It appears that only slivers of LCAs 3294B, 3237, and 2553:2 were part of the original parcel. The bulk was LCA 3387, as well as the "Konohiki Poalima" referred to in the property description on the Ordinance. That poalima is the rectangular area between LCA 3387 and LCA 2533, which is identified on the sketch in LCA 3387 as "Konohiki." It appears from your spreadsheet that you have been able to determine from the testimony that there were 9 loi on LCA 3387.

Please let me know if you have any further questions regarding the Brito, Haleakala, or Mendoza SWUPAs.

Robert,

Thanks for updating the spreadsheet. As I mentioned last week, we are following up trying to provide information that is missing or needs clarification. I would have hoped to have made more progress by now but got sidetracked with other urgent matters (and before I knew it another week had gone by). So, although there is still information outstanding, I thought I would start updating you on what I have and the status of some of the outstanding inquiries. These generally go in the order of your spreadsheet.

Re **Brito** (2215/2216N), this one is related to **Haleakala** (2236) and **Mendoza** (2256/2257N). All three parcels (TMK 3-3-2:3, 25 and 29) were originally part of one larger parcel (and the LCA Nos. were removed from the Tax Map when they were subdivided). We are trying to find the subdivision documents, which will hopefully include a map identifying the LCAs. In the meantime, from what I can tentatively determine, the reference to LCA No. 3488 in the Haleakala application appears to be incorrect and the unsubdivided parcel included portions of LCA 3294-B/RP 6102, LCA 3237, LCA 2553:1/RP 6529, and LCA 3387/RP 6065. Lets set this one aside until we can confirm with a map or other documentation.

Re **Doherty** (2225/2226N), it appears from the TMK map (enlargement attached) that parcel TMK 3-2-5:7 included all four of the LCAs (LCA 4295:1/RP 5401, LCA 4405-NN/RP 5104, LCA 3775:3, and LCA 3770:1) and the other two parcels (TMKs 3-2-5:6&8) were poalima. (LCA 3995:3, as you noted on the spreadsheet, does not appear on the TMK map, and it appears that it was a typographical error in the SWUPA.) The LCCA for parcel 007 is LCA 3775 that was attached to the SWUPAs did not include an apana 3, as you observed. This is another one of those situations where there were multiple LCAs with the same claim number. The LCA 3775 attached to the SWUPAs was for Apana 1; attached below is LCA 3775 to Anakalea which describes Apana 3. **LCA 3775, Apana 3 does not include TMK Parcel 007 according to the sketch.** You can see from the drawing of the parcel that it is the same parcel from which the "Bernadette Wallace" parcel (on the TMK map) derived, but it appears that a portion of it may have been used in the construction of the highway. I could not find any RP for that LCA (RP 5360, attached to the SWUPA, appears to be just for Apana 1 and 2 of LCA 3775), but the testimony attached to the SWUPA describes Apana 3 as being "a Moo of Kalo[.]" **Noted.**

Re **Go**, who has 5 SWUPAs (2231, 2232N, 2233, 2234N, and 2235N), you have noted missing information re four of them. **SWUPA 2232N** is for new use on TMK Nos. 3-2-11:78&79. Like you, I am unable to find those parcels on the TMK map, although the Maui County Real Property Tax website indicates that they exist. Lets set this one aside with the Brito/Haleakala/Mendoza SWUPAs while we try to locate appropriate maps. Re **SWUPAs 2233/2234N**, you have indicated that there is no reference to water use. Although the LCA (7713:24) (which was for the ahupua`a of Waihe`e as well as other large areas) may not refer to water use on the specific parcel, the land is on the southern bank of Waihe`e River adjacent to an auwai, and the applicant has indicated in her SWUPA that "the entire property is made up of ancient lo`i kalo terraces[.]" That should be sufficient to establish water use on the property.

**We will require written documentation (LCAs, RPs, etc.) referring to water use(s) at the time of the Mahele.** Finally, regarding **SWUPA 2365N**, your spreadsheet indicates that there is no reference to water uses for Apana 3 (of LCA 3507). After having reviewed the documents, it appears to me that the references to "3507:2" and "3507:3" on the TMK map (enlargement attached), for parcels 3-2-4:8 and 10, respectively, are inaccurate. LCA 3507 (attached as a tiff file so you can enlarge it) has only 2 apana. Apana 2 has 2 sections, or "mahele," separated by a poalima; the section on the left of the poalima, looking at the LCA drawing, is 0.85 acres and mahale 2, on the right of the poalima, is 0.20 acres, which precisely corresponds to the acreage of TMK parcels 8 and 10, respectively. Comparing the drawings and acreage to the TMK parcels, it appears clear that TMK 3-2-4: 10, which is identified on the TMK map as LCA 3507:3 is not really apana 3, but is actually mahele II of apana 2. The Native Testimony and Foreign Testimony (attached) indicate that Apana 2 was "Pauku Kalo" or "a section of lois," and that "there is one poalima in each piece." **Noted.**

Robert, et al.,

Thanks for getting us these. We are working on filling in any gaps, and will get you what we are able to find. In the meantime, though, I wanted to confirm that the appurtenant rights determination will include all Na Wai Eha users claiming appurtenant rights, not just those who have filed SWUPA-Es. We had always assumed that was the case, because it would not make sense to go through this twice, and existing v. new is not a distinction that has any meaning with respect to appurtenant rights. I also believe this has been discussed.

The reason I raise the issue is that on your Waihe`e spreadsheet, although there is one specific reference to a SWUPA-N, many of the kuleana applicants who have only new uses are not included on your list. For example, you have listed SWUPAs 2231 and 2233 for Diannah Goo, who has existing uses on the parcels covered by those applications. But she also has a SWUPA-N for TMK Nos. 3-2-4: 8 and 10, on which she has no existing use, and that one does not appear on your spreadsheet. Likewise, Lawrence Koki, who filed a SWUPA-N for TMK

3-2-3: 30, is not on the spreadsheet. For Piko A`u, the only parcel that shows up on the spreadsheet is TMK No. 3-2-6: 8, which is the subject of the SWUPA-E, but there is no reference to TMK 3-2-6: 19, which is included in Piko A`u's SWUPA-N. There may be other examples as well.

Please confirm that the appurtenant rights determinations are not limited to "existing" users.



**ORDINANCE NO. 1031**  
**BILL NO. 57 (1980)**

AN ORDINANCE CHANGING ZONING FROM COUNTY AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT TO R-3 RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT FOR PROPERTY LOCATED IN WAILUKU, MAUI, HAWAII

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. Land Zoning Map No. 3, showing Wailuku, the westerly portion of Kahului, and surrounding areas, is amended by redesignating that certain portion of Agricultural District situated at Wailuku, Maui, Hawaii and more particularly described hereinbelow to R-3 Residential District:

All of that certain parcel of land, being portions of the land and premises mentioned or described in R.P. 6102, L.C. Aw. 3294-B, Apana 1 Mahele 2 to Moomooiki, L.C. Aw. 3237 to Hewahewa; R.P. 6529, L.C. Aw. 2533 Apana 1 to Malahihi, R.P. 6065, L.C. Aw. 3387 to Pooliilii, and a Konohiki Poalima, situate at Kahewa, District of Wailuku, Island and County of Maui, State of Hawaii, and also identified as Tax Map Key 3-3-02:3, and containing an area of 0.65 acre more or less; and as shown more particularly on the map entitled "Land Zoning Map No. 340" on file in the office of the Department of Planning of the County of Maui.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.

WE HEREBY CERTIFY that the foregoing BILL NO. 57 (1980)




