This is a claim for land in Waikapa, Maui.
I know the land of the Claimant in Waikapa, it is the site of Waipua. It is in three pieces. One the lowland, one a high land in the valley, and the third a high mountain.

The Claimant received this from Hoapi's widow in 1836, and I never heard his title disputed to this day. Hoapi's widow saw Mr. Coffey's trouble in Lahaina, and gave him this land. He used to make clothes for her Grandson.

Joseph Gould now lives on the land, as Mr. Coffey has rented it to him. He has put in a Claim for a part of the lowland, but I don't know the foundation of the Claim. The land has been surveyed in part by Mr. Metcalf.

Mr. Humphreys in. I know the land of the Claimant. The testimony of Mr. Hamaikai is correct. I was with the surveyor Mr. Metcalf when he surveyed the land, and the old man Hamaikai who pointed out the land to Mr. Coffey in the first place went with him and pointed out the correct bounds of the lowland. The second and third pieces were of so small value that they were not surveyed.

Z. Kaauwai sworn He has seen 1 section, 2 sections he has not seen in the ili of Kaluapuaa in Waikapu. Land from Mrs. Hoapili in 1836. He has not heard of objections however Kaauwai has heard how Charles Copp had received this land from Mr.s Hoapili,

Mr. Charles Copp was Lota's friend, he was also Lota's tailor and because of the hardships of living in Lahaina, Mrs. Hoapili gave him this land. He has not known whether Nalei has interest in Wailuku.

This land has been surveyed, the map is on Oahu.

Kalua sworn He has seen Charles Copp's lands, and Nalei's land no. 10460. Nalei's patches are in Charles land and he had received it from Makole in 1846. He had not wanted this land he had felt he would received the land of Kaluapuaa permanently which would leave the Poalima only for Charles. Charles disapproved of this and asked Nalei to remain on his own interest.

Nalei lived on his own 14 patches at the time Charles went to Hana and he worked 4 days at a time for the Poalima at the request of Kuihelani. Later Nalei lived under that foreigner J. Lonzada. After I had left Joe, took my interest for Charles because he had felt, Nalei wanted all of the land for himself. Nalei has no land at this time.

William Humphreys sworn He has known this: Charles had come to Lahaina and he asked me for a suitable land in Waikapu.

Akoni C. sworn: I know of Puupahoehoe's living there. He occupied it in 1825 and we lived with him -- myself, George Richardson, William H. and William McLane. Nawaa was a friend of Puupahoehoe. Puupahoehoe built a house there which we occupied with him. It was known by everyone that he was living there, those of Waikapu and those of Wailuku, there was no one who did not know, and there was no opposition until 1848 when Z. P. Kaumaea objected.
