**EXISTING FRESHWATER PARK PLAN**

Currently, Freshwater Park includes a caretaker's residence, comfort station, concrete path, and various seating areas near the Walker Avenue entrance and boat ramp parking area. Most of the site is undeveloped and overgrown with non-native vegetation except for existing utility easement clearings.





**PROPOSED PROOF-OF-CONCEPT DESIGN PLAN**

The proposed proof-of-concept design for Freshwater Park includes a diversity of community gathering spaces to support outdoor recreation and cultural celebration. From the entry lanai to the sandalwood restoration forest, the history of plantation culture and native forest resources are reflected in the plantation-inspired architecture and landscape design. Fishing and recreational gear rental kiosks, park/disc golf, and the bass fishing lodge support the ongoing maintenance of the park while additional access trails increase park and town connectivity. Stormwater wetlands treat urban runoff and demonstrate the benefits of ecologically performative landscapes.
