## Background

- Pearl Harbor Water Shortage Plan adopted on August 18, 2020 <u>https://files.hawaii.gov/dlnr/cwrm/submittal/2020/sb20200818</u> <u>C1.pdf</u>
- Adopted plan established permit classification system and actions to be implemented in the event of a water shortage
- Commissioners requested:
  - Staff reach out to the public and report back to the Commission on any proposed revisions to the plan in one year

# WATER SHORTAGE WATCH

Water Shortage Condition

#### Trigger

USDA Drought Declaration; or

-1 standard deviation from average water levels in one or more CWRM Deep Monitor Wells for 2 quarterly measurements

#### Action

Joint "Call for Water Conservation" press release with BWS; and

Increase enforcement of water use reporting; and

Increase monitoring frequency from quarterly to monthly at CWRM DMWs; and

Begin regular coordination meetings with BWS, Navy, DOH and others

WATER SHORTAGE ALERT	BWS declaration of low groundwater conditions; or	WUP holders in the affected ASA to begin implementing their individual water shortage plans; and
	-2 standard deviation from average water levels in one or more CWRM Deep Monitor Wells for 3 monthly measurements	CWRM staff to begin emergency rulemaking process to declare a water shortage; and
		Continued increase of water use reporting enforcement and groundwater monitoring; and
		Continued coordination with entities identified in the water shortage watch stage

Water Shortage Condition

#### Trigger

-3 standard deviation from average water levels in one or more CWRM Deep Monitor Wells for 2 monthly measurements

#### Action

CWRM to complete emergency rulemaking process to declare a water shortage; and

CWRM to require permit holders to reduce their pumpage according to the regional water shortage plan permit classification scheme based on the permit holders last reported monthly pumpage prior to the Stage 2 Water Shortage being declared; and

Continued increase of water use reporting enforcement and groundwater monitoring; and

Continued coordination with entities identified in the water shortage watch stage

# Permit Classification Scheme

Priority Level	Permit Classification
	Domestic
1	Habitat Maintenance
2	Municipal
Z	Military
	Agricultural
3	Industrial
	Golf Course

Stage	Cutback
1. Water Shortage Watch	0% cutbacks
2. Water Shortage Alert	Follows percent reduction indicated in individual water shortage plan (IWSP); or 5% for permit holders who have not submitted a plan or indicated less than 5% reductions
3. Water Shortage Warning	Mandatory percent reductions based on permit classification scheme Priority 1: Follow IWSP
	Priority 2: 15% reduction
	Priority 3: 20% reduction

Post-Adoption Actions by CWRM Staff Meetings with largest water user: Honolulu Board of Water Supply

Extended the comment period

Requesting meeting with stakeholders based on comment letter received

Investigated current landowner/well owner contact information

Began drafting letters, notices, etc. needed to distribute in the event of water shortage conditions

Continue to collect monitoring data from the CWRM deep monitor well network in Pearl Harbor

Created online map with updated well trigger data
