MINUTES:

- Item H-5 -- CDUA FOR Keanae Road Improvements at Hana, Maui (Maui County, Department of Public Works).

Items on the Agenda were considered in the following order to accommodate those applicants present at the meeting:

## ITEM H-3 CDUA FOR AN OVERHEAD POWERLINE AT MAKUA, OAHU (MR. LYLE E. TOEPKE).

Mr. Ing felt that since this involves State land, either this process, or the disposition process, there ought to be some kind of condition with respect to the waterline. Reading the application, Mr. Ing noted that the waterline was not covered by the CDUA process. In the event they encounter archaeological findings, there should be a condition that they stop work.

Mr. Evans said that this condition is included with relation to the overhead line; however, they do not as it relates to the waterline. An attempt to satisfy this concern is on page 3, first paragraph, wherein the Historic Sites Branch commented that they had requested archaeologicla testing for the proposed waterline when this project was originally submitted as a CDUA application for an underground waterline and overhead powerline.

Mr. Paty asked the applicants, Messrs. Toepke and Tamashiro, to come forward.

To clarify on the waterline, Mr. Toepke said that they did an archaeological reconnaisance study, prior to the waterline, to test all along the waterline to identify whether there were any sites. There were sites on both sides of the road. During construction of the waterline there was also archaeological monitoring.

## AFTER-THE-FACT CDUA FOR AN ART STUDIO AND STORAGE AND SHED AT HAENA, KAUAI (MR. DAVID M. LACOCK).

Mr. Evans said that the applicant, about a year ago, had constructed a separate art studio without any government approval. In order to conform to the one-house-per-lot of past board actions, the kitchen and restroom facilities were suggested to be removed from the existing guest house. Staff is recommending denial and that the board impose a fine of \$500.00.

Mr. Lacock said that his plan for building an art studio came up about one and one-half year ago when he started to get a little frustrated in his big house and wanted a space where he could get away from his kids and paint. He needed a place for himself and his children to paint and be messy. This building was built primarily for an art studio. Most of his property is for farming but this studio was put in an area where he could not do farming. He went on to describe the type of structure that was built, his reason for building same, and the problems he encountered. He said that the toilet and sink was taken out. He never intended to use it as a guest house -- just an art studio.

As a point of clarification, Mr. Evans said that what we are really discussing are three separate structures. We have a house that has been approved by the board consisting of about 1300 sq. ft.; we have what is called an art studio/storage shed, which is basically two separate 220 sq. ft. structures that are connected, so we have three structures.

Mr. Paty asked Mr. Evans where he got three structures.

Mr. Evans explained that there is another structure on the platform where the so-called art studio is.

Mr. Arisumi asked Mr. Lacock about the amount of money he makes from farming.

Mr. Lacock said that he does not make much. He normally takes what he grows to the Health Food Store and they, in return, let him have something else. He said that he had over 100 banana trees and about 1200 pineapple plants.

Mr. Arisumi asked, "if you were to only retain one structure for your tools, etc. and have no art studio, can you live with that?"

Mr. Lacock felt that to be better than tearing the whole thing down. However, he explained that his art is also a big part of his livelihood. Having a place to create is very important to him because this is basically where he makes most of his money.

ACTION

Mr. Zalopany moved that the structure remain, without the toilet and tub, but that the sink remain. Said building not be used as a rental unit. However, the \$500.00 fine to be imposed.

Mr. Paty called for a second.

Mr. Ing found the motion difficult. He listened to what Mr. Lacock had to say and he found it very difficult to believe him and that he would follow the conservation district rules in the future. This is a person who purchased property from someone who was in violation, someone who was fined and forced to tear down the shed. This gentleman has lived in Haena for fifteen years so he should have known, from other people in the area, that because of the conservation district zoning that permits are required for structures. Mr. Ing found it incredible that he would not know that some kind of government permit was required before he put up his structure. If he had gone to the County he would have found out. The County would not have processed his application for a building permit because the land is conservation. He would then have been forced to come back to this board to seek a permit. Mr. Ing felt that if the board allows him to continue with this structure there is no telling what he will do in the future. Although he would like to see Mr. Lacock make a living, he just can't believe what has been said and is unwilling to go along with that.

Mr. Arisumi seconded the motion with an amendment that since Mr. Lacock is a part time farmer and there is no question that they need storage space—and a place to put the produce, he could not see the entire structure retained. His amendment is that one-half of the structure be retained for his tools for farming, etc.

Mr. Zalopany accepted Mr. Arisumi's amendment to his motion.

Mr. Ing said that if this gentlemen is going to become a commercial farmer, then he would probably need another CDUA.

Mr. Paty called for a vote on the motion as amended. Messrs. Zalopany, Arisumi and Paty voted yes. Messrs. Ing and Arata voted no. Motion died for lack of a majority vote.

(Note: Mr. Kealoha arrived at 10:25 A.M. He was not present when action was taken on Mr. Lacock's request.)

Mr. Ing thought that the deadline on this application was December 23rd.

Mr. Evans said that, absent a definitive action today by the Board, staff would be required to replace this on the board's agenda for action at the next board meeting, which would be held on Maui. The board, at that time, could reconsider today's action, or direct the staff to bring it back to the board.

Mr. Ing said that he was agreeable to having this brought back to the board for reconsideration; however, he would like to see photographs of the structures at the next meeting.
