PETITION FOR DECLARATORY RULING

Pursuant to Section 13-1-27 of the Hawai'i Administrative Rules ("HAR"), Petitioner Virgil H. Koehne, Jr., duly appointed Personal Representative of the Estate of Carol Ann Moore, aka Carol A. Moore

(hereinafter "Petitioner"), hereby petitions the Board of Land and Natural Resources for the following declaratory rulings:

1. That Carol Ann Moore, aka Carol A. Moore, was entitled to transfer her passenger vessel to a business entity owned by her and to have her commercial and offshore mooring permits reissued in the name of the transferee business entity pursuant to Haw. Rev. Stat. § 200-10(d);
2. That Ms. Moore's rights under section 200-10(d) did not lapse upon her death on November 2, 2012; and,
3. That Petitioner is entitled under Hawaii law to exercise the right of transfer and reissuance of the commercial permit for the benefit of the heirs of the late Ms. Moore.

I. PETITIONER AND HIS INTEREST

Petitioner is the duly appointed personal representative of the estate of Carol Ann Moore, aka Carol A. Moore (the "Estate").

Ms. Moore died on November 2, 2012. A true and correct copy of the Letters of Administration appointing Petitioner to such position is attached as Exhibit "A."

At the time of her death, Ms. Moore held a permit issued by the Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation, Department of Land and Natural Resources, State of Hawai'i ("DOBOR"), authorizing the commercial operation of a

passenger vessel from Lahaina Small Boat Harbor, Island of Maui, State of Hawai'i (the "VME Permit").

Ms. Moore also held a DOBOR permit to moor her leased vessel offshore of Lahaina Small Boat Harbor. True and correct copies of the two permits are attached as Exhibits "B" and "C."

The VME Permit will expire July 31, 2013.

On July 18, 2013, Petitioner in his capacity as personal representative of Ms. Moore's estate filed an application for renewal of the VME Permit. The substance of the application and supporting documents are identical to those submitted by Ms. Moore in the years prior to her death. A true and correct copy of Petitioner's application is attached as Exhibit "D."

III. STATUTES/RULES IN QUESTION

1. Haw. Rev. Stat. § 200-10(d).
2. Hawaii Probate Code, Haw. Rev. Stat. §§ 560:3-711 and 560:3-715

Section 560:3-711, entitled "Powers of personal representatives; in general," provides:

Until termination of appointment a personal representative has the same power over the title to property of the estate that an absolute owner would have, in trust however, for the benefit of the creditors and others interested in the estate. This power may be exercised without notice, hearing, or order of court.

Section 560:3-715, entitled "Transactions authorized for personal representatives; exceptions," provides in relevant part:

Except as restricted or otherwise provided by the will or by an order in a formal proceeding or by sections 531-28.5 and 531-29, and subject to the priorities stated in section 560:3-902, a personal representative, acting reasonably for the benefit of the interested persons, may properly:

(1) Retain assets owned by the decedent pending distribution or liquidation including those in which the representative is personally interested or which are otherwise improper for trust investment;

* * *

(6) Acquire or dispose of an asset, including land in this or another state, for cash or on credit, at public or private sale; and manage, develop, improve, exchange, partition, change the character of, or abandon an estate asset;

* * *

(9) Enter for any purpose into a lease as lessor or lessee, with or without option to purchase or renew, for a term within or extending beyond the period of administration;

* * *

(19) Sell or exercise stock subscription or conversion rights; consent, directly or through a committee or other agent, to the reorganization, consolidation, merger, dissolution, or liquidation of a corporation or other business enterprise;

* * *

(24) Continue any unincorporated business or venture in which the decedent was engaged at the time of the decedent's death:

(A) In the same business form for a period of not more than four months from the date of appointment of a general personal representative if continuation is a reasonable means of preserving the value of the business including good will;

(B) In the same business form for any additional period of time that may be approved by order of the court in a formal proceeding to which the persons interested in the estate are parties; or

(C) Throughout the period of administration if the business is incorporated by the personal representative and if none of the probable distributees of the business who are competent adults object to its incorporation and retention in the estate;

* * *

(25) Incorporate any business or venture in which the decedent was engaged at the time of the decedent's death; . . .

* * *

IV. CONCISE STATEMENT OF PETITIONER'S POSITION

The right of Ms. Moore under section 200-10(d) to transfer the VME Permit to a business entity and sell the entity after one year is an intangible asset of her estate.

Ms. Moore's rights under section 200-10(d) did not lapse on her death.

Under the Hawaii Probate Code, those rights including the right of transfer and the right to sell the transferee entity passed to Petitioner upon his appointment by the Second Circuit Court as Personal Representative of Ms. Moore's estate.

Petitioner is empowered to exercise the right of transfer so that the VME Permit may be held by a business entity owned by him for the beneficiaries of the estate and ultimately sold as allowed by section 200-10(d) on such terms and conditions as the Probate Court may approve and order.

DOBOR and its administrator, Edward R. Underwood, acted contrary to law in refusing to recognize the standing of Petitioner to exercise the rights of

Ms. Moore concerning the VME Permit, including the right to have it reissued in his capacity as personal representative of Ms. Moore's estate and ultimately in the name of a business entity controlled by Petitioner.

V. SUPPORTING FACTS AND AUTHORITIES

1. DOBOR issued the VME Permit effective August 1, 2012, for a twelve month term expiring July 31, 2013.
2. Ms. Moore had held a VME Permit for at least fifteen (15) years at the time of the July 2012 annual renewal.
3. At the time of her death, Ms. Moore had the right under Haw. Rev. Stat. § 200-10(d) to the transfer to the VME Permit and offshore mooring permit to a business entity owned by her.
4. Haw. Rev. Stat. § 200-10(d) provides in relevant part:

Any individual who is an owner of a vessel used for commercial purposes . . . and possesses a valid mooring permit or commercial permit, or both, in accordance with the rules adopted by the chairperson pursuant to chapter 91, may transfer ownership of the vessel from personal ownership to corporate or other business ownership without terminating the right to moor or operate the vessel under the permit or permits. The existing permit or permits shall be reissued in the name of the transferee corporation or other business entity.
5. The VME Permit was valid at the moment of Ms. Moore's death.
6. On May 6, 2013, Counsel for Petitioner wrote DOBOR requesting renewal of the VME Permit in the name of Petitioner.

A true and correct copy of the request is attached as Exhibit "E."

7. On May 21, 2013, Administrator Underwood denied the request citing the absence of administrative rule empowering DOBOR to transfer the VME Permit to an entity owned by the personal representative of Ms. Moore's estate. Mr. Underwood read the boating rules as allowing transfer of the VME Permit in only one circumstance - - had Ms. Moore been married and survived by a spouse.
8. Because Ms. Moore was unmarried at the time of passing, Administrator Underwood mistakenly believed DOBOR could not allow reissuance of the permit in the name of Petitioner for the benefit of any other survivor.
9. This conclusion represents grievous error and must be corrected by this Honorable Board.

VI. CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, Petitioner requests a declaratory ruling that:


1. Ms. Moore's rights under section 200-10(d) did not lapse upon her death on November 2, 2012;
2. DOBOR is obligated to reissue the VME Permit and offshore mooring permit in the name of Petitioner as representative of Ms. Moore's estate; and,

3. Petitioner is entitled to transfer the VME Permit to a business entity controlled by him for the benefit of the heirs of Ms. Moore.

For relief, Petitioner requests that the Board direct DOBOR staff to process his pending application; direct re-issuance of the VME Permit and Offshore mooring permit to him in his representative capacity; and, transfer the permits to an entity owned by Petitioner for eventual sale in accordance with section 200-10 and such further terms and conditions as may be ordered by the Probate Court.





1. The permittee agrees to abide by all Small Boat Harbors Rules promulgated by the Department. Any violations of the provisions of the aforementioned rules, in addition to any fines or penalties a court of law may impose, this permit to operate a vessel commercially in LAHAINA HARBOR may be revoked.
2. The permittee agrees to operate the vessel described in this permit in accordance with all Coast Guard Rules and Regulations regarding passenger-carrying and commercial vessels.
3. The permittee agrees to present proof of Coast Guard certification for the vessel described in this permit to the Department, its officers or agents upon request.
4. While in the harbor specified, the vessel will be operated and moored in accordance with directions of the Department representatives.
5. The charge for this commercial permit will be the mooring fee of \$200.00 per month, or 3% of the vessel's gross receipts, whichever is greater.
6. The mooring charge of \$200.00 is due and payable in advance of the first day of the month in the Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation office. Not later than 30 days following the end of the month, the Permittee will submit to the Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation a report of gross receipts for the month plus payment of any additional amount required by the percentage of gross specified in Paragraph 5. Unless paid on time, this permit WILL AUTOMATICALLY EXPIRE.

EXHIBIT "B"

7. This commercial permit may be terminated by the Department by written order of its representative for proper cause and the said vessel will cease commercial operations in LAHAINA HARBOR.
8. During scheduled recreational events such as fishing tournaments, yacht races, etc., vessels operating under commercial permits may be required to adjust their schedules for use of harbor facilities and/or temporarily cease using harbor facilities commercially by proper authority.
9. The permittee agrees to notify the Department in writing of any change in master or captain of the vessel within 7 days of the date of change.
10. The permittee shall at all times use due care for public safety and shall defend, hold harmless and indemnify the State, its officer, agents and employees from and against all claims or demands for damages, including claims for property damage, personal injury or death arising out of or incident to the operation or mooring of said vessel.
11. The permit charges are for the privilege of operating this commercial vessel in LAHAINA HARBOR in the manner stated above. Any other use of harbor property and services must be requested and approved separately.
12. This permit shall not exceed one year from 08/01/2012 and unless it is renewed before the expiration date, the permit shall expire on 07/31/2013. Before renewal, harbor authorities must sight the permittee's latest annual General Excise/Use tax return to the State of Hawaii and all fees and charges due paid in full.

Dear Mr. Underwood:

I am writing to you on behalf of the estate of Carol A Moore. Ms. Moore died on November 2, 2012. At the time of her death, she held the above-referenced commercial permit, a true copy of which you will find attached to this letter.

It appears the subject permit was first issued in 1997. It has been renewed annually since with the current iteration set to expire on July 31, 2013.

In 1998, Ms. Moore incorporated Malia Kai Marine Services, Inc., for the ostensible purposes of holding the VME permit and avoiding personal liability for claims that could arise from commercial operations. Inexplicably the permit was never transferred to the entity. We continue to investigate the circumstances of this matter but it appears Ms. Moore may have suffered from cognitive and emotional deficits that prevented the exercise of sound judgment and attention to this important detail.

Section 200-10(d), Hawaii Revised Statutes, provides in relevant part:

Any individual who is an owner of a vessel used for commercial purposes . . . and possesses a valid mooring permit or commercial permit, or both, in accordance with the rules adopted by the chairperson pursuant to chapter 91, may transfer ownership of the vessel from personal ownership to corporate or other business ownership without terminating the right to moor or operate the vessel under the permit or permits. The existing permit or permits shall be reissued in the name of the transferee corporation or other business entity.

Ms. Moore indisputably met these conditions at the time of her death.


Mr. Speedie reports that Lahaina Harbor boating officials have been notified of Ms. Moore's passing and that they agreed to allow the vessel to continue operating for the remaining term of the VME permit. At the same time, he indicates, the permit may have been offered to the senior applicant on the commercial permit waiting list. If true, we believe this would be a serious error.

Nothing in the statute or boating rules suggests that the survivors of a permit holder may not exercise the decedent's right of transfer so long as all other requirements can be met. Such is the case here. Clearly the purpose of the statute was to sanction transfers. We can find no reason to deny that right to decedent's estate acting through its personal representative.

We expect to file for the appointment of a special administrator within the next few days. Once that process is complete, the personal representative will contact Maui District Manager Stacy Masuda to initiate the transfer in accordance with existing requirements.

We look forward to continued assistance and cooperation of Ms. Masuda and her staff. In the interim, we would be happy to address any questions and to supply updated information as our investigation progresses.
