**Declare Project Exempt From Requirements of Chapter 343, HRS, and Title 11,
Chapter 200, Hawaii Administrative Rules**

The Board of Land & Natural Resources approved the award of the construction contract for the subject project on July 12, 2013. Pursuant to Chapter 343, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), and Chapter 11-200, Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR), the attached Exemption Notification labeled Exhibit A was prepared.

The project consists of the construction of an accessible, multi-use concrete walkway, picnic areas, landscaping and signage along Diamond Head Road.

In accordance with Hawaii Administrative Rule Section 11-200-8(A) and Exemption List for the State of Hawaii, Department of Land and Natural Resources, Division of State Parks, dated December 4, 1991, the subject project is exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment pursuant to Exemption Class 3, Item No. 4, that states "Construction of park picnic tables [February 5, 1976]; Item No. 10, that states "Construction of park directional, identification, safety and interpretive signs [February 5, 1976]; and Item No. 18, which states, "Construction of park walkways [February 5, 1976]."

RECOMMENDATION:

Declare that, after considering the potential effects of the proposed project as provided by Chapter 343, HRS, and Chapter 11-200, HAR, this project will probably have minimal or no significant effect on the environment and is therefore exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment.

EXEMPTION NOTIFICATION

Project Description:	Scope of work consists of the construction of an accessible, multi-use concrete walkway, picnic areas, landscaping and signage along Diamond Head Road.
Chapter 343 Trigger(s):	Use of State Funds
Exemption Class and Description:	Exemption List, December 4, 1991, Exemption Class 3, Construction and location of single, new, small facilities or structures and the alteration and modification of same and installation of new, small, equipment and facilities and the alteration and modification of same including but not limited to: (A) Single family residences not in conjunction with the building of two or more such units; (B) Multi-unit structures designed for not more than four dwelling units if not in conjunction with the building of two or more such structures; (C) Stores, offices and restaurants, designed for total occupant load of twenty persons or less, if not in conjunction with the building of two or more such structures; and (D) Water, sewage, electrical, gas, telephone, and other essential public utility services extensions to serve such structure or facilities; and accessory or appurtenant structures including garages, carports, patios, swimming pools and fences [HAR §11-200-8(a)(3)].
Exemption Item Number and Description:	Item No. 4, Construction of park picnic tables [February 5, 1976]. Item No. 10, Construction of park directional, identification, safety and interpretive signs [February 5, 1976]. Item No. 18, Construction of park walkways [February 5, 1976].
Recommendation:	It is anticipated this project will probably have minimal or no significant effect on the environment and is presumed to be exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment.
