The Board of Land and Natural Resources approved the award of the construction contract for the subject project on July 12, 2013. Pursuant to Chapter 343, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), and Chapter 11-200, Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR), the attached Exemption Notification labeled Exhibit A was prepared.

The project consists of resurfacing the existing asphalt concrete handicapped parking stalls for truck and car with concrete, and replacing the existing access path striping with an ADA compliant access path.

In accordance with Hawaii Administrative Rule Section 11-200-8(a) and the Exemption List for the Department of Land and Natural Resources, Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation as reviewed and concurred upon by the Environmental Council on March 22, 1995, the subject project is exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment pursuant to Exemption Class No. 1, that states, "Operations, repairs, or maintenance of existing structures, facilities, equipment or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion or change of use beyond that previously existing". RECOMMENDATION:




