The 2014 Legislature approved a Chapter 42F, HRS, Grant-In-Aid Capital Improvement Project on behalf of the Hawaiian Mission Children's Society DBA Hawaii Mission Houses Historic Sites and Archives in accordance with the Act 134, SLH 2013, as amended by Act 122, SLH 2014, Section/Item No. 39. Pursuant to Chapter 343, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), and Chapter 11-200, Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR), the attached Exemption Notification labeled Exhibit "A" was prepared.

The project consists of the renovation and restoration to the 1841 Annex, 1821 Mission House and restrooms to meet ADA requirements, along with repairs to the property site security fence and gates, and upgrades to the climate control system.

In accordance with Hawaii Administrative Rule Section 11-200-8(A) and the Exemption List for the Department of Land and Natural Resources, as reviewed and concurred upon by the Environment Council on December 4, 1991, along with the May 26, 2015 consultation with OHA, the subject project is exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment pursuant to Exemption Class No. 2, Item No. 3 that states "General actions involving the rehabilitation/restoration of existing structures at historic sites [December 4, 1991]".

RECOMMENDATION:

Declare that, after considering the potential effects of the proposed project as provided by Chapter 343, HRS, and Chapter 11-200, HAR, the project will probably have minimal or no significant effect on the environment and is therefore exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment.
