**Declare Project Exempt From Requirements of Chapter 343, HRS, and Title 11,  
Chapter 200, Hawaii Administrative Rules**

**Job No. OA16-09, Maunalua Bay Boat Ramp Parking and Roadway Pavement Repairs  
Honolulu, Oahu, Hawaii**

The Board of Land & Natural Resources approved the award of the construction contract for the subject project on July 10, 2015. Pursuant to Chapter 343, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), and Chapter 11-200, Hawaii Administrative Rules (HAR), the attached Exemption Notification labeled Exhibit A was prepared.

The Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation is proposing improvements to the Maunalua Bay Boat Ramp which includes the repaving of existing unpaved and paved parking and roadway areas and security lighting at the existing washdown facility.

In accordance with Hawaii Administrative Rule Section 11-200-8(A) and the Exemption List for the Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR), Approved by the Environmental Council, on June 5, 2015, this project is exempt from the preparation of an Environmental Assessment (EA) pursuant to the following exemptions:

Scope of Work #1a: Paving of existing unpaved parking and roadway areas.

Exemption Class 4, Item No. 4: Improvements of previously graded parking and storage yard areas, including paving, infilling, grading and compacting.

Scope of Work #1b: Paving of existing paved parking and roadway areas.

Exemption Class 2, Item No. 21: Replacement or reconstruction of existing roadways, roadway shoulders, road structures and signage, parking areas, walkways, bikeways, multi-use pathways, driveways, and boat launch ramps.

Scope of Work #2: Installation of security lighting at the existing boat washdown facility.

Exemption Class 3, Item No. 9: Construction of security features, including fencing, gates, camera, lighting, and other similar items.

**RECOMMENDATION**

Declare that, after considering the potential effects of the proposed project as provided by Chapter 343, HRS, and Chapter 11-200, HAR, these projects will probably have minimal or no significant effect on the environment and is therefore exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment.


