REMARKS:

MC&A Inc. is requesting a right-of-entry permit to utilize a portion (2,000 sq. ft.) of Fleming Beach for a beach day event for the Toyota Dealers Family Program. The event is scheduled for July 15, 2016, from 6:30 a.m. -6:00 p.m. The request is to utilize an area of the shoreline for the organized storage of miscellaneous beach activity equipment such as beach toys, wicker loungers with beach umbrellas and beach chairs set up for the participants to utilize.

Staff will require that the applicant provide an individual to monitor all equipment to assure that it is properly stored in an orderly manner within the permitted area while items are not in use.

Staff brings this request to the Board pursuant to the policy adopted at its meeting of June 14, 2013, Item D-11, as amended. The proposed activity is of a similar type and scope of beach activities that periodically occurred and continue to occur on this and other beach areas across the State. Such activities have resulted in no known significant impacts, whether immediate or cumulative, to the natural, environmental and/or cultural resources in the area. As such staff believes that the proposed event/use would involve negligible or no expansion or change in use of the subject area beyond that previously existing. Staff has consulted with other divisions regarding similar events in the past, with no finding of significant immediate or cumulative impact.

The applicant has not had a lease, permit, easement or other disposition of State lands terminated within the past five years due to non-compliance with such terms and conditions.

There are no other pertinent issues or concerns. Staff has no objections to this request.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Board:

- 1. Declare that, after considering the potential effects of the proposed disposition as provided by Chapter 343, HRS, and Chapter 11-200, HAR, this project will probably have minimal or no significant effect on the environment and is therefore exempt from the preparation of an environmental assessment.
- 2. Authorize the issuance of a right-of-entry permit to MC&A Inc. (Event Manager) for Storage and Use of Recreational Equipment for a Beach Day Event for the Toyota Dealers Family Program, covering the subject area under the terms and conditions cited above, which are by this reference incorporated herein and further subject to the following:
 - a. The standard terms and conditions of the most current right-of-entry permit form, as may be amended from time to time;
 - b. Such other terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the Chairperson to best serve the interests of the State.




