

OPINION NO. 62

The Commission has been asked whether the state ethics law prohibits an employee from accepting part-time employment, given the following pertinent facts:

The employee collected and annotated information in the area of his specialty on other than state office hours. This work was published by the State with his consent. A publisher has asked him to revise and enlarge the original effort on his own time, offering him compensation.

Under these circumstances, the Commission finds no violation of chapter 84, HRS, but advises him to act in accordance with the principles stated in Opinion No. 21.
