

## OPINION NO. 67

A permanent, full-time civil service employee, whose duties primarily involve clerk-steno skills, has inquired whether he may work part-time evenings, weekends and holidays for a service corporation. He is concerned because some assignments will be to assist at political conventions and other political party-related activities.

The Commission advises him that the state ethics law does not prohibit him from accepting such part-time employment because it does not appear to interfere with his state duties and is not so directly related to his state job so as to present problems under the provisions of the law relating to confidential information and unwarranted treatment. The fact that an assignment may be incidentally connected with a particular political party is not relevant to this opinion.
