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FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, AND DECISION AND ORDER ACCEPTING A FINAL ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT

The Land Use Commission ("Commission"), having examined the Final Environmental Impact Statement ("FEIS") filed by Kapolei Property Development, LLC ("Petitioner"), on October 26, 2006, and upon consideration of the matters discussed therein, at its meeting on November 2, 2006, in Kailua-Kona, Hawai'i, hereby makes the following findings of fact and conclusions of law:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. On March 17, 2006, Petitioner filed a Petition For Land Use District Boundary Amendment ("Petition").
- 2. The Petition requested the reclassification of approximately 331.674 acres of land, identified as Tax Map Keys: 9-1-14: por. 33 and 34 and 9-1-15: por. 20

("Petition Area"), from the State Land Use Agricultural District to the State Land Use Urban District.

- 3. The Petition included an Environmental Impact Statement Preparation Notice ("EISPN"), pursuant to sections 343-5(a)(1), Hawai'i Revised Statutes ("HRS"), and section 11-200-6(b)(1)(A), Hawai'i Administrative Rules ("HAR").
- 4. On April 6, 2006, and by a written Order dated May 24, 2006, the Commission (i) agreed to be the accepting authority pursuant to chapter 343, HRS; and (ii) determined that the proposed action may have a significant effect on the environment to warrant the preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement ("EIS").1
- 5. The Office of Environmental Quality Control ("OEQC") published notice of the EISPN in its April 23, 2006, issue of *The Environmental Notice*, which began a 30-day public comment period that ended on May 23, 2006.
- 6. Upon receipt of the comments, Petitioner prepared a Draft Environmental Impact Statement ("DEIS"), which was transmitted to the OEQC on July 27, 2006. The OEQC published notice of the availability of the DEIS in its August 8, 2006, issue of *The Environmental Notice*, which began a 45-day public comment period that ended on September 22, 2006.

¹ At the Commission's April 6, 2006, meeting, Petitioner stated that it would amend the Petition to include approximately 12.845 acres of land, identified as TMK: 9-1-14: 35, within the Petition Area. The addition of parcel 35 increases the total area of the Petition Area to approximately 344.519 acres.

- 7. On August 7, 2006, Petitioner filed an Amended Petition that reflected, among other things, the addition of TMK: 9-1-14: 35 to the Petition Area.
- 8. The following federal, state, and city and county agencies; public utility; community/non-profit organizations; and individuals provided responses on the DEIS: the U.S. Department of the Interior, U.S. Geological Survey; the U.S. Department of the Interior, Fish and Wildlife Service; the Commission; the State Office of Planning ("OP"); the State Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism, Strategic Industries Division; the State Department of Accounting and General Services; the State Department of Education; the State Department of Transportation; the State Department of Health, Environmental Planning Office (included comments from the Wastewater Branch, Safe Drinking Water Branch, Clean Water Branch, Clean Air Branch, and the Hazard Evaluation & Emergency Response Office); the OEQC; the Office of Hawaiian Affairs; the University of Hawai'i Environmental Center; the City and County of Honolulu ("C&C") Department of Planning and Permitting ("DPP"); the C&C Department of Design and Construction; the C&C Department of Environmental Services; the C&C Department of Parks and Recreation; the C&C Department of Community Services; the C&C Board of Water Supply; the C&C Fire Department; Hawaiian Electric Company, Inc.; the Smithsonian Institution, National Museum of Natural History; the Hawai'i Audubon Society; the Conservation Council for Hawai'i; KAHEA: The Hawaiian Environmental Alliance; Alyssa Miller; Kimberly Tice; Shannon

Wianecki; Chris E. Buddenhagen; Teya Penniman; Shad Kane; Eileen Helmstetter;

Daniel Tanaka; Choon James; Douglas Lamerson; Floyd W. McCoy; Stanley Bergstrom;

George Hinol; Jan Welda Fleetham; Annette Kaohelauli`i; Keith Krueger; Nicholas P.

Kalodimos; Joseph Watts; Phyllis Ha; and Suzanne L. Varady.

- 9. On October 26, 2006, Petitioner filed the FEIS with this Commission.
- 10. On November 2, 2006, the Commission met in Kailua-Kona, Hawai'i, to consider acceptance of Petitioner's FEIS. Benjamin A. Kudo, Esq.; Naomi Kuwaye, Esq.; Jeff Overton; and Steve Kelly appeared on behalf of Petitioner. Bryan C. Yee, Esq., and Abe Mitsuda appeared on behalf of OP. By letter dated November 2, 2006, the DPP notified the LUC staff that it would not be present at the meeting, and further that the DPP had no comments on the acceptance of the FEIS. At the meeting, Petitioner argued that the FEIS should be accepted because it complied with the requirements of chapter 343, HRS, and chapter 11-200, HAR. Petitioner also filed a revised Table 9.1 entitled Consulted Parties (pages 9-1 through 9-4) to the FEIS, as reflected in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The revised table listed the names of additional individuals that provided comments on the DEIS and corrected certain typographical errors. Following the presentation, the OP stated that it had no objection to the acceptance of the FEIS.

- 11. The Commission finds that the FEIS, as supplemented by the revised Table 9.1, generally conforms to the content requirements of section 11-200-18, HAR, to the extent that it includes (i) the DEIS revised to incorporate substantive comments received during the consultation and review process; (ii) reproductions of all letters received containing substantive comments; (iii) a list of persons, organizations, and public agencies commenting on the DEIS; (iv) the responses of Petitioner to each substantive question, comment, or recommendation received in the review and consultation processes; and (v) text written in a format that allows the reader to easily distinguish changes made to the text of the DEIS.
- 12. After due deliberation at the Commission's meeting on November 2, 2006, a motion was made and seconded to accept Petitioner's FEIS, as supplemented by the revised Table 9.1. There being a vote tally of 5 ayes and 4 absent, the motion carried.


CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Pursuant to chapter 343, HRS, and the EIS Rules under chapter 11-200, HAR, and a motion having been made at a meeting on November 2, 2006, in Kailua-Kona, Hawai`i, and the motion having received the affirmative votes required by section 15-15-13, HAR, and there being good cause for the motion, this Commission concludes that Petitioner's FEIS, as supplemented by the revised Table 9.1, generally

satisfies the criteria and procedures governing the acceptance of an FEIS under section 11-200-23, HAR.

DECISION AND ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the FEIS filed by Petitioner under Docket No. A06-763/Kapolei Property Development, LLC, as supplemented by the revised Table 9.1, be ACCEPTED pursuant to chapter 343, HAR, and chapter 11-200, HAR.
