#### **Project Summary**

The PFM Group's study of the Hawaii tax system continues to progress according to schedule. The project team is working toward completing activities associated with Phase 2 (Information Gathering). In recent weeks, the project team has conducted additional phone interviews with key stakeholders and subject matter experts and has followed up as needed to obtain any relevant data or reports. These calls (and the earlier on-site meetings) have been very useful for understanding the State's taxation issues from a variety of stakeholder perspectives.

Additionally, the team continues to build and refine the models that will be used to analyze tax burden and regressivity on differing income cohorts. Finally, the project team has completed construction of the Excel model that will be used for assessing options and opportunities related to tax and revenue alternatives for the State. This model will be a key resource for subsequent steps in the project.

#### Key Activities through April 15, 2017

The project team conducted the following activities in accordance with Phase 2 of the project plan:

- Continued to work with departments to collect relevant data to populate the revenue model and conduct other analyses regarding the State's tax structure.
- Refined models to assess tax burden and regressivity.
- Completed construction of model to assess impact of revenue alternatives for use in the analytical and recommendations phases of the project; revenue projection are based on COR data as of March 13, 2017.
- Continued to schedule and hold interviews and follow-up meetings via conference call with internal and external stakeholders and subject matter experts. Most recently, the project team spoke with several key leaders of the Hawaii Tourism Authority. For a full list of interviews conducted to date, see Appendix A.



# Planned Activities April 15-30, 2017

The project team will continue/complete the following Phase 2 activities:

- Remotely attend the Tax Review Commission meeting on April 24, 2017 to provide an update to TRC members regarding the status of the project.
- Refine the tax burden and regressivity models.
- Begin evaluating the impact of various revenue-generating initiatives on the State's pension and retiree health care obligations.
- Continue to develop the key areas in which there are opportunities to benchmark Hawaii that could potentially impact the baseline and/or key drivers of the financial models.
- Continue to conduct best practices research on tax structure and tax policy issues that are applicable to the State of Hawaii.
- Schedule and hold interviews and follow-up meetings via conference call with internal and external stakeholders and subject matter experts. The project team is scheduled to speak with Reg Baker of the Chamber of Commerce and continues to attempt to schedule a phone meeting with Senator Jill Tokuda, Chair of the Senate Ways and Means Committee. It has also been suggested that the project team schedule a call with Damien Elefante, Deputy Director of the Department of Taxation, and that contact will be initiated as well.
