Dear Governor Lingle:

In its November 3, 2010 meeting, the Council on Revenues lowered the growth rate estimate of Hawaii total personal income from 2.3% to 2.0% for calendar year 2010 but maintained its August 3, 2010 forecast of 3.0% for calendar year 2011.

According to the latest estimates from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA), total personal income grew at a rate of 1.5% during the first and second quarters of 2010, after being almost flat in 2009. In its latest revision, BEA lowered the first quarter of 2010 estimate from 2.3% to 1.5%.

The Council's forecast changes primarily reflect BEA's downward revision for the growth in personal income in the first quarter of 2010 and in prior quarters, along with other economic conditions discussed by the members, including strong visitor numbers so far during this year. Substantial data revisions may still be forthcoming because of the outsized changes to employment, income and economic activity generally during the 2007-09 recession.

The revised total personal income data for calendar years 2005 through 2009, as well as the Council's forecasts for 2010 and 2011, are listed below:
