Dear Madam President:

In House Concurrent Resolution No. 62, House Draft 1, Senate Draft 1, the 2008 Legislature has requested a study of the social and financial impact of mandatory health insurance coverage for use of medical surveillance systems pursuant to Sections 23-51 and 23-52, Hawai'i Revised Statutes (HRS). The proposed measure referenced for study is Senate Bill No. 409, Senate Draft 2, House Draft 1.

Based on our preliminary review of the relevant measures, we found that the definition of "medical surveillance systems" in Senate Bill No. 409, Senate Draft 2, House Draft 1, is identical to the definition of "intelligent medical vigilance" reported about in our *Study of the Social and Financial Impacts of Mandatory Health Insurance Coverage for Use of Intelligent Medical Vigilance Services in Acute Care Hospitals*, Report No. 08-05, March 2008. As defined in Senate Bill No. 409, Senate Draft 2, House Draft 1, "medical surveillance system" does not refer to a specific health care service subject to an assessment under Section 23-51, HRS. For this reason, an impacts assessment by us of medical surveillance systems would result in the same finding and conclusion as our previous report. Therefore, we will undertake no further study for our part of this concurrent resolution.
