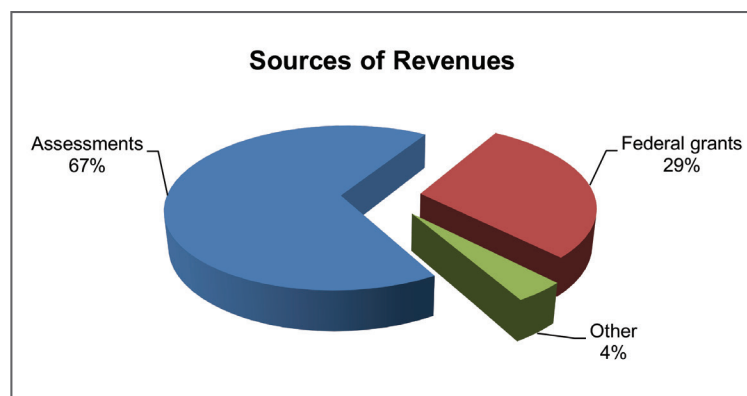
**THE PRIMARY PURPOSE** of the audit was to form an opinion on the fairness of the presentation of the financial statements for the Department of Transportation, Administration Division (DOT–Administration), as of and for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2016, and to comply with the requirements of Title 2 U.S. Code of Federal Regulations Part 200, Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (Uniform Guidance), which established audit requirements for state and local governmental units that receive federal awards. The audit was conducted by Egami & Ichikawa, Certified Public Accountants, Inc.

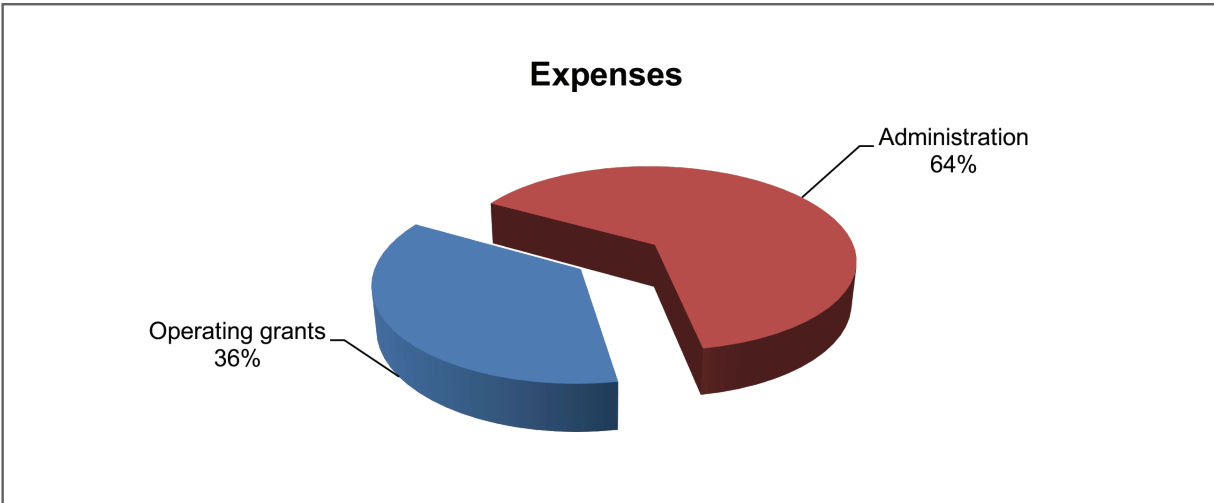
### About the Division

**DOT–ADMINISTRATION** consists of the Office of the Director of Transportation, the Statewide Transportation Planning Office, and departmental staff services offices. Collectively, these offices provide the overall administrative support for the Department of Transportation (DOT). The Statewide Transportation Planning Office administers certain Federal Transit Administration and Federal Highway Administration grants. DOT–Administration financial statements reflect the financial activities of DOT–Administration and the Aloha Tower Development Corporation. DOT–Administration reports as assessment revenues a percentage of the Airports, Harbors, and Highways divisions' state allotted appropriations for the cost of the general administration expenses of DOT.

### Financial Highlights

**FOR THE FISCAL YEAR** ended June 30, 2016, DOT–Administration reported total revenues of \$26.6 million, total expenses of \$22 million, and transfers to other DOT divisions of \$6.8 million resulting in a decrease in net position of \$2.2 million. The transfers related to unencumbered cash balances related to assessment revenues from those divisions. Revenues primarily consisted of \$17.7 million from assessments, \$7.7 million from federal grants, and \$1.2 million from other revenue sources.





As of June 30, 2016, total liabilities of \$18.9 million exceeded total assets of \$17.8 million, resulting in a deficit in net position of \$1.1 million. DOT–Administration has an unrestricted deficit of \$9.6 million. Total assets of \$17.8 million were comprised of cash of \$11.7 million, accounts receivable of \$5.2 million, and net capital assets of \$900,000. Liabilities totaled \$18.9 million, including a \$3.8 million Aloha Tower Development Corporation note payable to the Department of Transportation, Harbors Division.

## Auditors' Opinions

**DOT – ADMINISTRATION RECEIVED AN UNMODIFIED OPINION** that the financial statements were presented fairly, in all material respects, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. DOT–Administration also received an unmodified opinion on its compliance with major federal programs in accordance with the *Uniform Guidance*.

## Findings

**THERE WERE NO REPORTED DEFICIENCIES** in internal control over financial reporting that were considered to be material weaknesses and no instances of noncompliance or other matters that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*. There were no findings that were considered material weaknesses in internal control over compliance in accordance with the *Uniform Guidance*.
