Sir :

The Legislative Committee, to whom was referred
Article 12 of the proposed Constitution, relating to the right of eminent domain, beg leave to report :

That we approve of the intent of the proposed Article, with the exception of the provision that private land may be taken for private use by others than the owners thereof for reservoir purposes.

And it is with hesitation that we have adopted the amendment relating to the use of private property for private railways.

The utilizing of water for purposes of irrigation so tends to develope the resources of the country, that it is a matter of public interest, and, we believe, that under existing conditions the right to take private property for such purposes should come under the principle of the right of eminent domain. And it is urged that the necessity for extending the facilities of transportation, in the development of our agricultural industries, justified such taking for private railways. The majority of the committee believe this view to be correct.

While the agitation of Women suffrage is a new departure here, it is not so in many other Places, In several States of the United States, Women have full suffrage, in several others they vote on municipal questions, and in many others they vote only on matters relating to Schools.

In the State of Wyoming, Women have had full suffrage for the last twenty five years, and its workings there cannot be better stated than by quoting what its Governor, and Legislature have said.

"Section 7. No name shall be placed upon the Register of voters for either Senators or Representatives except upon the personal appearance of the applicant before the Board of Registration at an advertised public meeting of the Board."

There are two objects sought to be attained by the amendment ; the first resulting from the striking out of Section 6 immediately preceding thus making it necessary that voters for both Representatives and Senators at the first election shall register ; and the second to provide that names shall be placed upon the Register only at advertised public meetings of the Board, thus insuring publicity to all registrations.



The Legislative Committee, to whom was referred Section 1 of Article 101 (page 110) as amended, together with the amendments by Delegate Ables and Councillor Waterhouse, beg leave to report:

That they recommend the adoption of the amendment proposed by Mr. Ables, so that after the word "duty", in line 6 the remainder of the Section shall read: "maladministration in office or assessment of office-holders for partisan or political expenses."

In the opinion of the committee the amendment proposed by Mr. Waterhouse is unnecessary, and out of place in this section.

The Article relates to the power of the Legislature to impeach public officers, and not to the executive power to remove subordinates from office. The addition of the proposed amendment, in this connection, might be capable of misconstruction.


We therefore recommend that Mr. Waterhouse's amendment be laid up on the table.

Sir:

Your committee on the Judiciary to whom was referred Article 91 together with the proposed amendments thereto beg leave to report that we have had the matter under consideration and recommend a substitute article to read as follows:

Article 91. Office Holders.

Sec. 1. All persons holding office under the Provisional Government of the Hawaiian Islands at the date of the promulgation of this Constitution shall continue to hold and exercise all the power to them granted until such office shall become vacant.

Sec. 2. All commissions issued by or under authority of the late Monarchy or of the Provisional Government of the Hawaiian Islands, are hereby declared to be vacated, null and void, from and after the first day of September, 1894, unless cancelled prior to that date.





of the Senators - your committee, after careful consideration, are of the opinion that it is best to extend the first term to 1901 as in the Draft.

There are reasons why it would be well to have the Senators elected for the second term for 2 - 4 & 6 years, in order that they may go out of office one third at a time, but as it is advisable that there should be only 15 Senators, it is difficult to make an equitable division of the number to be elected in each election District, so that one third can go out at each general election.

An equitable division of the Senators would give Hawaii 4 and Kauai 2 Senators. Any arrangement we can make so that the Senators will go out at different times, complicates the election system.

Your committee therefore, believing that the advantages to be derived

Fourth. That the right of franchise be granted to all such Chinese as may be competent to qualify under the electoral provisions of the new Constitution.

Fifth. Reciprocity of treatment "under the most favored nation clause" of treaties, with other powers pending the consideration of a treaty between Hawaii and the Imperial Chinese Government, or in other words equal rights with those of all otherx alien residents, subjects or citizens.

To the second prayer this Committee say, that the constitution now under consideration contains no invidious or class restriction as to who shall or shall not be permitted to enjoy the right of franchise, all classes and all residents of these Islands that can fully satisfy its provisions shall have the right to use and enjoy that privilege.

To the third prayer this Committee say, that the Advisory Council as now constituted, is the sole judge of the qualifications of its members, ^{and} ~~such~~ alone has the power of electing members to its body. And further, that under the terms of the constitution, now under consideration, all and every resident or citizen of these Islands, who can under the provisions of that constitution be eligible to a seat in the body that will succeed the Advisory Council, ~~is~~ and can be a member of the body so succeeding.

To the fourth prayer this Committee say, the same answer applies as is given to the second prayer.

To the fifth prayer this Committee say, that this Convention has no jurisdiction over the subject matter therein set forth, and that the same is foreign to the purposes for which it is convened.

This Committee therefore respectfully recommend



formulating a constitution, and no other matter can or be considered, that is not pertinent or relevant to such a purpose. To the second prayer this Committee say, that the constitution now under consideration contains no provisions or class restriction as to who shall or shall not be permitted to enjoy the right of franchise, all classes and all residents of these Islands that can fully satisfy its provisions shall have the right to use and enjoy that privilege.

To the third prayer this Committee say, that the Advisory Council as now constituted, is the sole judge of the qualifications of its members, and shall alone have the power of electing members to its body. And further, that under the terms of the constitution, now under consideration, all and every resident or citizen of these Islands, who can under the provisions of that constitution be eligible to a seat in the body that will succeed the Advisory Council, and can be a member of the body so succeeding.

To the fourth prayer this Committee say, the same answer applies as is given to the second prayer.

To the fifth prayer this Committee say, that this Convention has no jurisdiction over the subject matter therein set forth, and that the same is foreign to the purposes for which it is convened.

Martin, Chairman of the Board of Inspectors for the second precinct of the second district, rejected many ballots without the consent of his co-inspectors.

He finds that the charge against Mr. Martin is not sustained. Mr. Martin's co-inspectors, C. M. Thomas and Peter Souza, state that no ballots were rejected without their consent and approval.



A careful examination of the ballots cast in the several precincts shows that many errors were made by the Inspectors in counting ballots which should have been rejected, and in rejecting ballots that were in no respect illegal. The following table shows the number of ballots which were counted by the Inspectors but which should have been rejected because they were either wrongly marked, or contained marks or symbols other than the figures indicating the number of votes cast.
