On reaching the locality
The Commander of the Escort will command,

The Procession passing between the entrance and Aieae the Escort will move to their seats. At the approach of the President, the Commander of the Escort will command

GRAND HONORS!
ESCORT FORM ARCH!

As the President is passing the Arch, the signal by the Herald is given to

TABU! BOW!!
As the President crosses the "Sacred Cord of Ahuula." Those that have privilege to pass over the Cord with the President, are the

CUP BEARER AND KAHILI BEARER.

The Sacred Cord is then raised, and no one is allowed to pass.

The President, Secretary and the Treasurer will then take their seats in front of the Arch. The Cup Bearer and the Kahili Bearer will remove their Badge of Office to the other room to be resumed on the return of the procession.

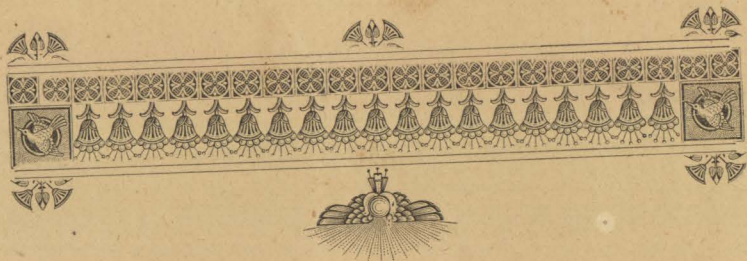

I.

Visit to the Palace at 10:30 or 11 A.M. for the inspection of the Feather Mantles, Capes and Museum.

II.

An Exhibition of the "POOMAIKELANI EQUESTRIAN CLUB" on horses and in custom.

III.

Conferring upon Their Royal Highnesses the Honorary Membership of the Ancient Order of the Sacred Cord and Royal Arch of the "HALE NAUA," and the investiture of the order of the "Knights of the Temple of Science."

IV.

DIRECTIONS.—The Equestrian Club will meet at Haimoeipo and proceed in procession, moving first through Palace Walk and Hotel Street, turning to the left down Alakea Street to King Street, turning to the left on King Street at a moderate gallop to Punch Bowl, then up and turn in at Palace Walk; thence down Richard Street up King Street, up Likelike Street around the Palace on Richard Street, thence enter the Main Entrance and Station themselves as escort to the Prince and Princess to Honuakaha; pass in front of the Hau tree, line in front of, address the Prince and Princess, and then retire.

The Royal Party will then proceed to inspect the Charts of the "Diametral Physiograph of the Earth," and from there to Healani Hale, where the ceremony of investiture will take place.
