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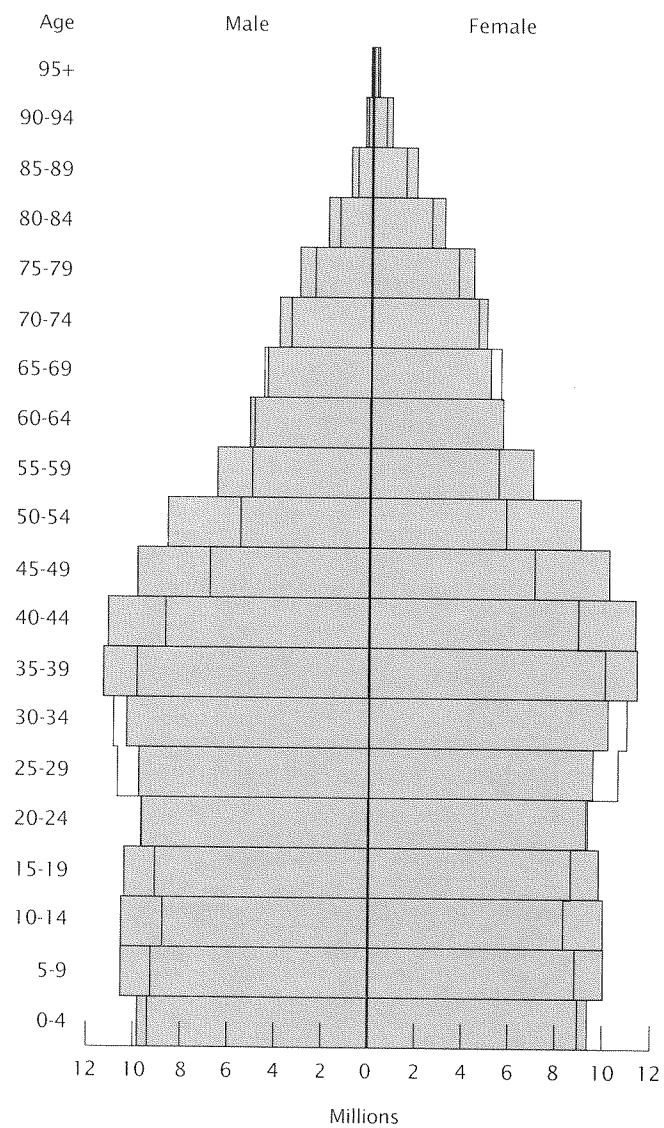

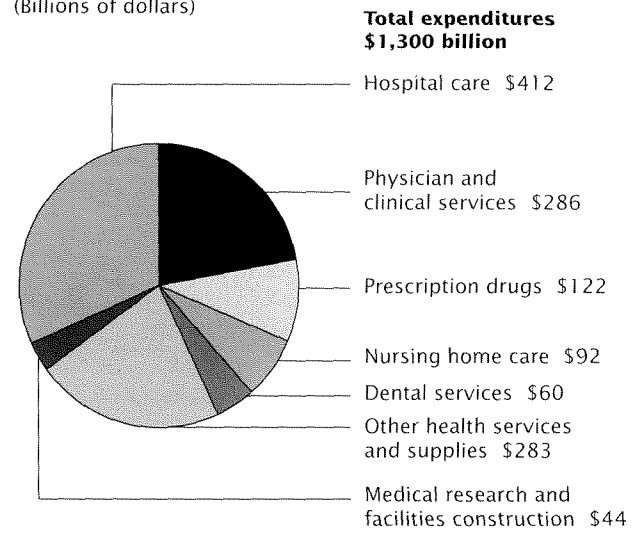

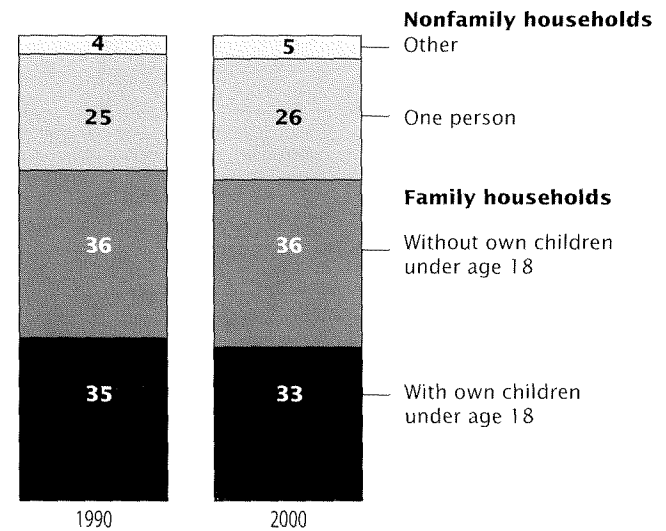

(Billions of dollars)



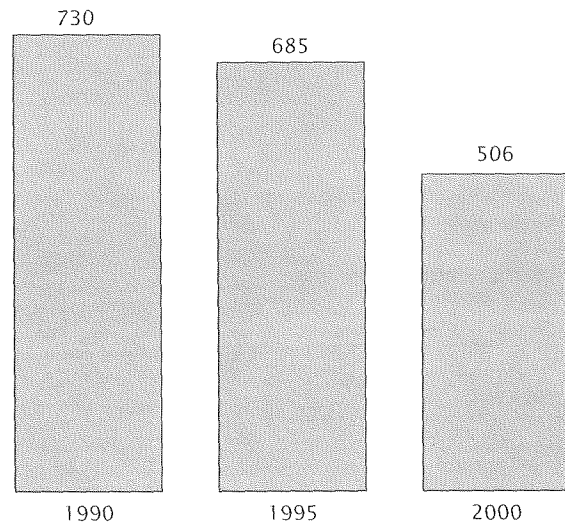
Households by Type—Percent Distribution: 1990 and 2000



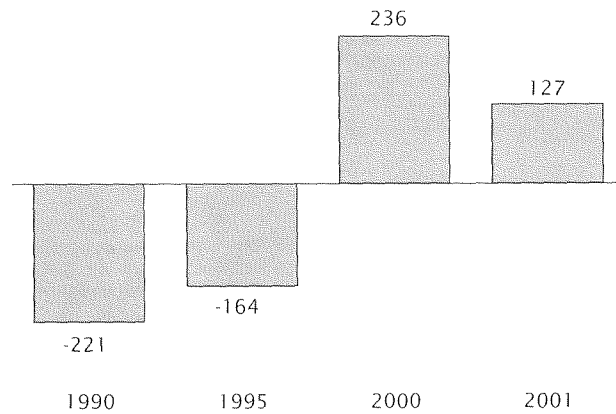

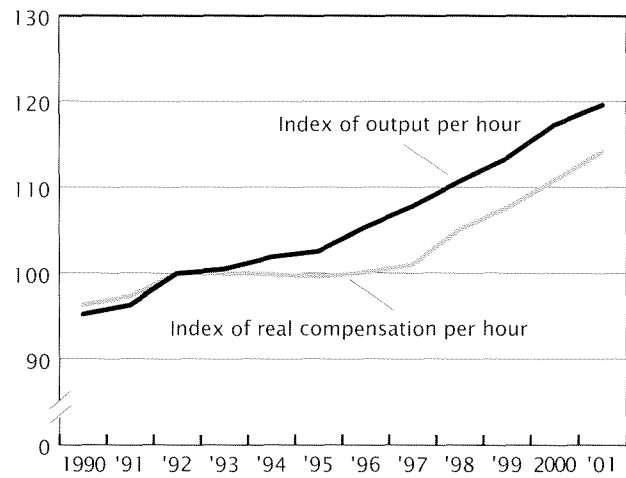

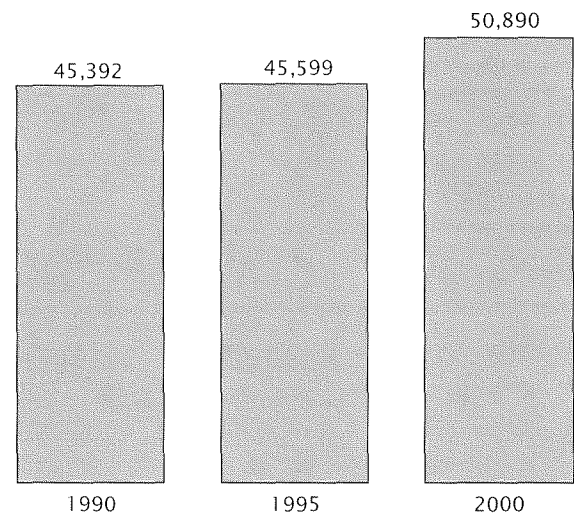
Index of Productivity and Compensation: 1990 to 2001

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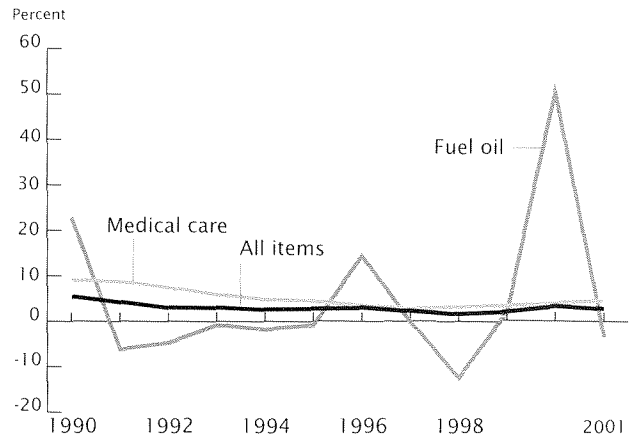

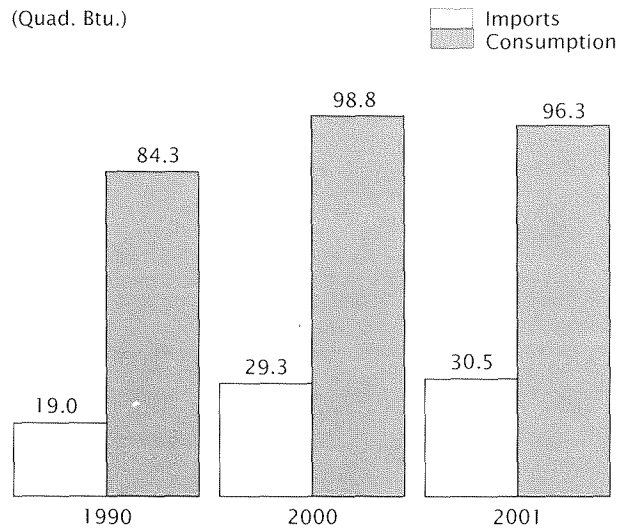

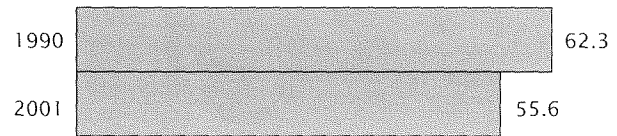

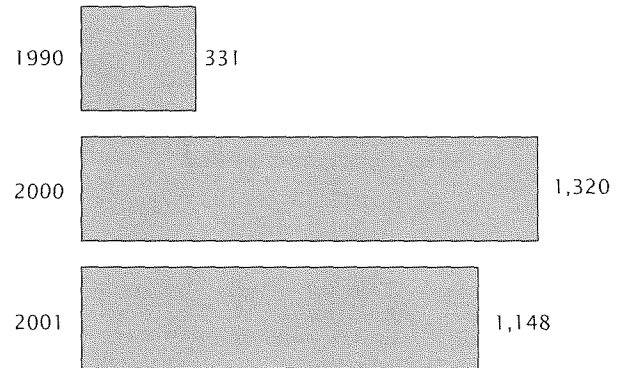
Cable TV Subscribers: 1990 and 2001
