## **American Community Survey**

- A survey developed by the Census Bureau to provide demographic, economic, and housing profiles of America's communities every year.
- The ACS will replace the long form in 2010.
- The ACS is conducted using mailed questionnaires, telephone interviews, and visits from Census field representatives.
- Questions similar to the Census 2000 long form.
- Full implementation beginning in late 2004 with 3 million households in sample.



**AMERICAN COMMUNITY SURVEY**

A New Approach for Timely Information

The American Community Survey (ACS) is a new nationwide survey designed to provide communities a fresh look at how they are changing. It is intended to eliminate the need for the long form in the 2010 Census. The ACS will collect information from U.S. households similar to what was collected on the Census 2000 long form, such as income, commute time to work, home value, veteran status, and other important data. As with the official U.S. census, information about individuals will remain confidential.

Three Million Households to be Surveyed

The ACS will collect and produce population and housing information every year instead of every ten years. About three million households will be surveyed each year. Collecting data every year will reduce the cost of the official decennial census, and will provide more up-to-date information throughout the decade about trends in the U.S. population at the local community level. A similar program is planned for Puerto Rico.

Expanding Local Coverage

The ACS began in 1990 and has expanded each subsequent year. Data currently are available for 200 local areas, including 239 counties, 205 congressional districts, most metropolitan areas of 250,000 population or more, all 50 states and the District of Columbia.

Starting in 2004, the Census Bureau plans to conduct the ACS in every county of the U.S., contacting the residents of three million housing units. Within three years, data should be available for all areas of 85,000 or more. For small areas of 20,000 or less, it will take five years to accumulate a large enough sample to provide estimates with accuracy similar to the decennial census.

Early Results Available for Many Communities

The ACS program also operated the Decennial Supplementary Survey, a three-year test program conducted each year from 2000 to 2002. Its purpose was to ascertain the feasibility of running such a large-scale program simultaneously with the official census. The Supplementary Surveys collected the same kind of information as on the Census 2000 long form. Supplementary Survey results from 2000 and 2001 are available for the entire U.S., all 50 states and D.C., and large areas and population groups of 250,000 people or more. In 2002, the Supplementary Survey data was published with the 2002 American Community Survey data. Detailed results from all these surveys can be obtained from the [Data Sets](#) page.

These estimates are derived from a sample of housing units and measure the true values with a degree of uncertainty. In the tabular profiles this uncertainty is represented by the 90 percent confidence interval given for each estimate. For further information on confidence intervals see the Accuracy of the Data document.

Caution should be used when comparing data by race for years before 1999 with those for 2000 due to the Census Bureau's implementation of the October 1997 revised standards for data on race and ethnicity. For the 2000 data, respondents may report one or more races and there are seven (American Indian and Alaska Native, Asian, Black or African American, Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, White, Some other race, and Two or more races) instead of five racial tabulation categories. The Two or more races category includes all respondents who reported more than one race. See the methodology section for more details regarding these changes.

In addition, caution should be used when comparing population numbers by age, race, and sex for 2000 with all earlier years. The numbers for 2000 have been weighted to be generally consistent with Census 2000 counts.
