U.S. Interim Projections by Age, Sex, Race, and Hispanic Origin

The population projections associated with this release were produced by the Population Division as an interim product to meet the immediate needs of our user community for national projections that incorporate the results of Census 2000. While not encompassing the full matrix of race and Hispanic-origin categories, the race groups for which these interim population projections are available include: (1) White alone, (2) Black alone, (3) Asian alone, and (4) All other races alone and Two or More Races. Other groups include: (1) Hispanic origin, (2) Hispanic White alone, (3) non-Hispanic origin, and (4) non-Hispanic White alone.

The beginning population for these projections is the resident population of the United States classified by age, sex, race, and Hispanic origin consistent with the Census 2000 modified race data. For an explanation of modified race, see http://eire.census.gov/popest/data/national/tables/files/mod_race.php. The assumptions about the components of population change (fertility, mortality, and international migration) are based on those developed for the last full set of projections released in January 2000.

Note: The 2000 to 2003 projections have been superseded by estimates which are available on the Estimates site at <http://eire.census.gov/popest/estimates.php>.

State Population Projections

The Population Projections Program produces projections of the resident population for each of the 50 states and the District of Columbia by age, sex, race, and Hispanic origin, consistent with the national population projections. The state projections are based on state-specific data on births, deaths, international migration, and domestic migration. Although several alternative series are produced, the preferred, or middle series--based on the assumption that past and current trends will continue--is most commonly used.

HAWAII'S POPULATION PROJECTIONS: 1995 TO 2025

OVERVIEW

* Hawaii had a population of 1.2 million people in 1995. Among the 50 states and District of Columbia, the state ranked as the 40th most populous. By 2000, it is projected to be the 41st most populous with 1.3 million people. By 2025, it is projected to be the 39th most populous with 1.8 million people.

* Over the three decades, Hawaii's total population is expected to increase 625 thousand people. Among the 50 states and District of Columbia, the state's net gain ranks as the 28th largest. Its rate of population change, at 52.7 percent, ranks as the 3rd largest. From 1995 to 2000, the
