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2006 Population Estimates

The Population Estimates Program at the Census Bureau develops and prepares estimates of the population by age, sex, race, and Hispanic origin for the nation, states and counties, prepares estimates of the total population of functioning governmental units, and estimates of the number of housing units for states and counties. These estimates are consistent with the decennial census residence definition of usual residence and represent the Census Bureau's official estimates of updated census counts for these areas.


