## 2009 American Community Survey 1-Year Estimates for the State of Hawaii

The U.S. Census Bureau released data from its 1-year American Community Survey (ACS) for 2009 on September 28, 2010.

The ACS survey started in 1996 and Hawaii was included since 2000. Between 2000 and 2004, Hawaii ACS data were available only for the State of Hawaii and the City and County of Honolulu. Starting in 2005, Hawaii County and Maui County (excluding Kalawao County) were included. Census Bureau releases 1-year data for areas with population size of 65,000 and above due to sample size issues. With an estimated population of 64,529 in 2009, Kauai County is not included in the results of the 1-year ACS survey. Kauai County information is included in the 5-year and 3-year ACS data which will be released in December 2010 and January 2011, respectively.

## Following are the fact found for Hawaii from the 2009 ACS survey:

## Hawaii's ranking in the nation:

Looking at the population characteristics and compared with other states in the nation, Hawaii continues has the following trends:

More Asians: Hawaii ranked \#1 in terms of percentage of Asian population. 37.1 percent of Hawaii's population said that they were Asians only (selected only one racial group) in 2009 versus 4.5 percent for the nation as a whole. Our state also ranked the highest for percent of people born in Asia.

More Native Hawaiians and Other Pacific Islanders: Hawaii also had the largest percentage of Native Hawaiians and Other Pacific Islanders only in the nation: 8.8 percent for Hawaii versus 0.1 percent for the nation in 2009.

More mixed population: Hawaii ranked \#1 also in the percentage of mixed ethnic population at 23.6 percent compared with 2.4 percent for the nation.

Higher household size: The average household size of 2.82 persons placed Hawaii 6th highest in the nation.

More households with elderly person: The percentage of households with one or more people 65 years and over was 28.6 and our state ranked \#2 in the nation. Not surprisingly, we also ranked high in the nation at \#4 for percent of households with retirement income. The percentage of our households receiving retirement income was 21.4.

More multigenerational households: Our state ranked the highest in the U.S. for percent of households that are multigenerational at 7.7\%.

Less grandparents responsible for their grandchildren: Hawaii is ranked the lowest at 51, for percent of grandparents living with grandchildren who are responsible for their grandchildren. Hawaii had $21.2 \%$ of the households in this category.

Higher use of public transportation or car pool: Hawaii ranked \#1 in percentage of workers using carpool to go to work with $14.0 \%$ of our population in this category. Hawaii ranked \#7 in the nation for proportion of population who travel to work by public transportation with $6.0 \%$ of our workers using this type of transportation.

More people work in the service sector: Hawaii ranked \#2 in the nation in percentage of workers working in the service occupations with $23.0 \%$ of our workers in this category.

Higher value of real property: Hawaii's median housing value was \$517,600 in 2009, ranking the highest in the nation, with Washington D.C. right below our state at $\$ 443,700$. The national median housing value in 2009 was $\$ 185,200$.

Lower home ownership: Hawaii's home ownership of 56.7 percent in 2009 was among the bottom 4 states and district in the nation. Washington D.C. had the lowest home ownership at 44.8 percent. New York State was the $2^{\text {nd }}$ lowest at 55.0 percent; California was the $3^{\text {rd }}$ lowest at 56.6 percent.

Higher cost of living: Hawaii's median rent of \$1,293 in 2009 placed Hawaii as the \#1 in the nation. The U.S. median rent was $\$ 842$ per month. Hawaii homeowner's monthly housing cost of $\$ 2,282$ in 2009 was the $3^{\text {rd }}$ highest in the nation. Our state also ranked high for proportion of income spent on housing. The percentage of mortgaged owners spending 30 percent or more of household income on selected monthly owner costs was second highest in the nation. For percentage of renter-occupied units spending 30 percent or more of household income on rent and utilities, Hawaii was ranked \#3 in this category listing.

More people per room: With the U.S. having 3.2\% of its occupied housing units with 1.01 or more occupants per room, Hawaii stood out in this category and ranked \#1. The percentage of our state's housing units with more than one person per room was $8.5 \%$.

Higher health insurance coverage: 7\% of Hawaii residents didn’t have health insurance coverage in 2009. In another word, 93\% of Hawaii residents were covered by health insurance, this ranked Hawaii the $2^{\text {nd }}$ place in the nation. In terms of health insurance coverage for children, $97.5 \%$ of Hawaii's children were covered, ranked the $2^{\text {nd }}$ place in the nation in 2009.

In 2009, the total population for the State of Hawaii was 1,295,178, with 1,260,211 people residing in households and 34,967 people living in group quarters.

There were a total of 446,136 households in the state in 2009. Of these, 310,366 (69.6\%) were family households (people live in a household are related by married, by birth, or by adoption).

In 2009, 17.3\% of our state's population was foreign born. $7.3 \%$ of Hawaii's total population in 2009 was not a U.S. citizen.

## State and County Demographic Characteristics (Table 2a and 2b):

- Male and female composition was about 50:50 both at the state and the county level.
- Honolulu County had a higher proportion of people who were age 65 and above at 14.9 percent compared with the other counties. Maui County had the least share of old age population at 12.7 percent.
- Hawaii County and Maui County had a larger proportion of White population than Honolulu County, while Honolulu County had more Asians than the other two counties.


## State and County Social Characteristics (Tables 3a and 3b):

- Maui County had a higher percentage (31.3\%) of high school graduates than other counties for persons 25 years of age or above. Honolulu County had a higher percentage of Bachelor's degree or higher in its labor force than the other two counties.
- In the State of Hawaii, 16.6 percent of the people moved to a different house between 2008 and 2009. Maui County topped the list with 20.6 percent of their population changing residences over that period of time. Honolulu County ranked second at 16.8 percent. In last place was Hawaii County where 14.6 percent of the people moved between 2008 and 2009.
- 13,622 people moved into Honolulu County from a foreign country between 2008 and 2009. Maui County received 668 people from abroad, and Hawaii County added 779 residents from foreign countries.


## State and County Economic Characteristics (Tables 4a and 4b):

- Hawaii County had the highest civilian unemployment rate in 2009 at $11.5 \%$, while Honolulu County has the lowest civilian unemployment rate at $6.0 \%$. Maui County's civilian unemployment rate was $7.3 \%$.
- Honolulu County had the highest median household income at $\$ 67,744$ in 2009, Hawaii County had the lowest median household income at \$53,828 and Maui County's median household income was between the above two counties at \$60,502.
- Honolulu County also had the highest median family income at \$78,956 in 2009, and Hawaii County had the lowest median family income at $\$ 64,385$. Maui County's median family income was $\$ 67,544$.
- Honolulu County had the highest health insurance coverage in 2009 at $94.3 \%$, followed by Maui County at $90.4 \%$, and Hawaii County at $89.6 \%$.
- Poverty rate was the lowest in Maui County with $8.9 \%$ of the county's residents were under poverty in 2009, while Hawaii County had the highest poverty rate at 14.4\%. Honolulu had a poverty rate of $9.9 \%$ in 2009.


## State and County Housing Characteristics (Tables 5a and 5b):

- Hawaii County had the highest homeownership at 63.1 percent in 2009, followed by Maui County at 57.6 percent. Honolulu County had a home ownership of 54.7 percent.
- Median housing value for owner-occupied units was the highest on Maui at \$586,500 in 2009, followed by Oahu at $\$ 552,100$. The Big Island had the lowest median housing value at $\$ 349,300$ per unit in 2009.
- Median housing cost for owners, as well as for renters, were the highest in Honolulu County at $\$ 2,432$ and $\$ 1,374$ per month, respectively. The Big Island had the lowest cost for both homeowners and renters at $\$ 1,693$ per month for home owners and $\$ 1,058$ per month for renter.
