
NOTE. HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES: In 2005-2009 there were 97 households in Maunaloa CDP. The average household size was 3.8 people.

Families made up 74 percent of the households in Maunaloa CDP. This figure includes both married-couple families (59 percent) and other families (15 percent). Nonfamily households made up 26 percent of all households in Maunaloa CDP. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

The Types of Households in Maunaloa CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009






NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE: One percent of the people living in Maunaloa CDP in 2005-2009 were foreign born. Ninety-nine percent was native, including 92 percent who were born in Hawaii.

Among people at least five years old living in Maunaloa CDP in 2005-2009, 1 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, less than 0.5 percent spoke Spanish and 100 percent spoke some other language; less than 0.5 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: In 2005-2009, 96 percent of the people at least one year old living in Maunaloa CDP were living in the same residence one year earlier; 4 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, less than 0.5 percent from another county in the same state, less than 0.5 percent from another state, and less than 0.5 percent from abroad.

Geographic Mobility of Residents of Maunaloa CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009





EDUCATION: In 2005-2009, 94 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 5 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Six percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Maunaloa CDP was 180 in 2005-2009. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was 5 and elementary or high school enrollment was 170 children. College or graduate school enrollment was less than 0.5.

The Educational Attainment of People in Maunaloa CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009






DISABILITY: In Maunaloa CDP, among people at least five years old in 2005-2009, percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to percent of those 65 and older.

INDUSTRIES: In 2005-2009, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Maunaloa CDP were Public administration, 31 percent, and Retail trade, 15 percent.


OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: Among the most common occupations were: Service occupations, 62 percent; Sales and office occupations, 16 percent; Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, 16 percent; Management, professional, and related occupations, 7 percent; and Farming, fishing, and forestry occupations, less than 0.5 percent. Sixty-six percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 34 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and less than 0.5 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.

TRAVEL TO WORK: Ninety percent of Maunaloa CDP workers drove to work alone in 2005-2009, less than 0.5 percent carpooled, less than 0.5 percent took public transportation, and 10 percent used other means. The remaining less than 0.5 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 41.8 minutes to get to work.

INCOME: The median income of households in Maunaloa CDP was \$27,888. Eighty percent of the households received earnings and 21 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Thirteen percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$11,046. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

POVERTY AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT PROGRAMS: In 2005-2009, 69 percent of people were in poverty. Eighty-six percent of related children under 18 were below the poverty level, compared with less than 0.5 percent of people 65 years old and over. Sixty-four percent of all families and 73 percent of families with a female householder and no husband present had incomes below the poverty level.


Poverty Rates in Maunaloa CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009

POPULATION OF Maunaloa CDP: In 2005-2009, Maunaloa CDP had a total population of 370 - 210 (57 percent) females and 160 (43 percent) males. The median age was 17.9 years. Fifty percent of the population was under 18 years and 4 percent was 65 years and older.

The Age Distribution of People in Maunaloa CDP, Hawaii in 2005-2009



For people reporting one race alone, 6 percent was White; 2 percent was Black or African American; less than 0.5 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; 5 percent was Asian; 62 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and less than 0.5 percent was Some other race. Twenty-six percent reported Two or more races. Seven percent of the people in Maunaloa CDP was Hispanic. Six percent of the people in Maunaloa CDP was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Maunaloa CDP had a total of 120 housing units, 18 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 97 percent was in single-unit structures, 3 percent was in multi-unit structures, and less than 0.5 percent was mobile homes. Seventy-eight percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Maunaloa CDP had 97 occupied housing units - 10 (10 percent) owner occupied and 87 (90 percent) renter occupied. Twenty-two percent of the households did not have telephone service and 6 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Forty-three percent had two vehicles and another 11 percent had three or more.
