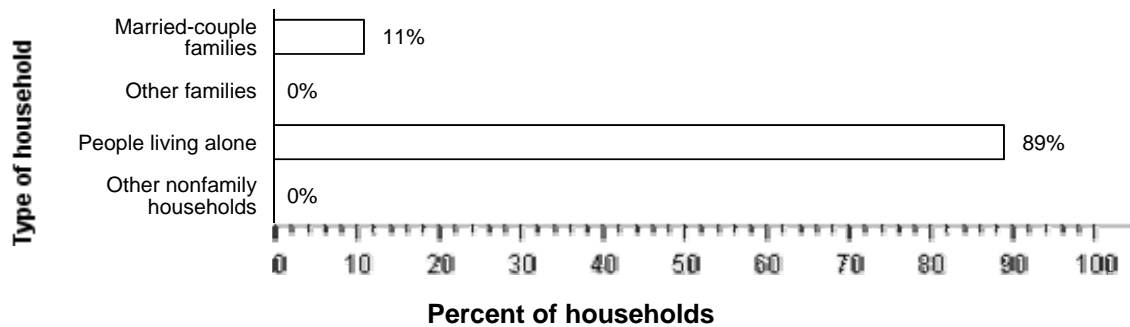
NOTE. HOUSEHOLDS AND FAMILIES: In 2005-2009 there were 71 households in Kalawao County. The average household size was 1.1 people.

Families made up 11 percent of the households in Kalawao County. This figure includes both married-couple families (11 percent) and other families (less than 0.5 percent). Nonfamily households made up 89 percent of all households in Kalawao County. Most of the nonfamily households were people living alone, but some were composed of people living in households in which no one was related to the householder.

The Types of Households in Kalawao County, Hawaii in 2005-2009



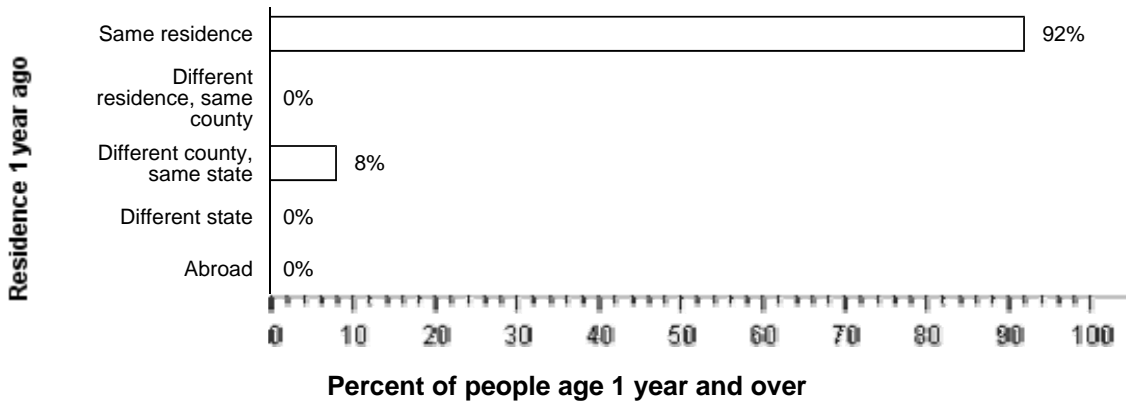

NATIVITY AND LANGUAGE: Seventeen percent of the people living in Kalawao County in 2005-2009 were foreign born. Eighty-three percent was native, including 51 percent who were born in Hawaii.

Among people at least five years old living in Kalawao County in 2005-2009, 15 percent spoke a language other than English at home. Of those speaking a language other than English at home, less than 0.5 percent spoke Spanish and 100 percent spoke some other language; 25 percent reported that they did not speak English "very well."

GEOGRAPHIC MOBILITY: In 2005-2009, 92 percent of the people at least one year old living in Kalawao County were living in the same residence one year earlier; less than 0.5 percent had moved during the past year from another residence in the same county, 8 percent from another county in the same state, less than 0.5 percent from another state, and less than 0.5 percent from abroad.

Geographic Mobility of Residents of Kalawao County, Hawaii in 2005-2009

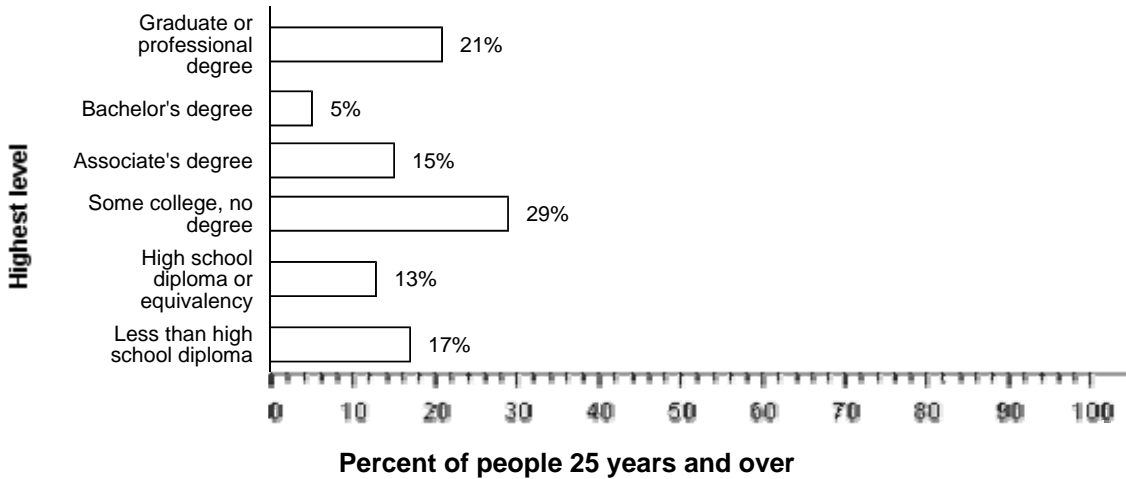

EDUCATION: In 2005-2009, 83 percent of people 25 years and over had at least graduated from high school and 26 percent had a bachelor's degree or higher. Seventeen percent were dropouts; they were not enrolled in school and had not graduated from high school.

The total school enrollment in Kalawao County was 6 in 2005-2009. Nursery school and kindergarten enrollment was less than 0.5 and elementary or high school enrollment was less than 0.5 children. College or graduate school enrollment was 6.

The Educational Attainment of People in Kalawao County, Hawaii in 2005-2009

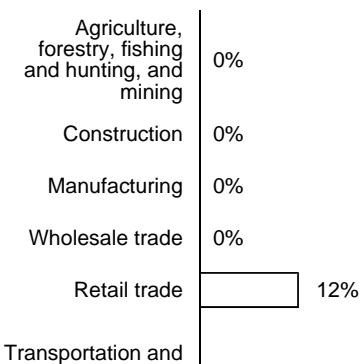


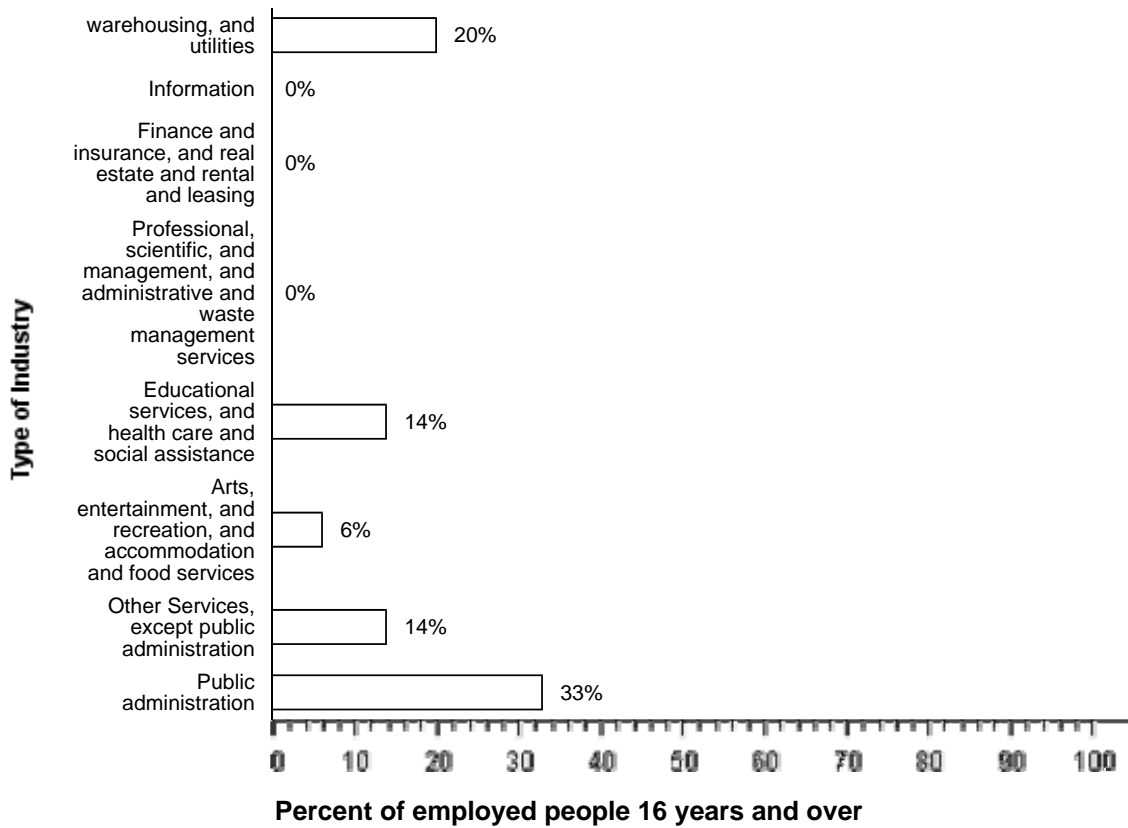

DISABILITY: In Kalawao County, among people at least five years old in 2005-2009, percent reported a disability. The likelihood of having a disability varied by age - from percent of people 5 to 15 years old, to percent of people 16 to 64 years old, and to percent of those 65 and older.

INDUSTRIES: In 2005-2009, for the employed population 16 years and older, the leading industries in Kalawao County were Public administration, 33 percent, and Transportation and warehousing, and utilities, 20 percent.

OCCUPATIONS AND TYPE OF EMPLOYER: Among the most common occupations were: Management, professional, and related occupations, 55 percent; Sales and office occupations, 23 percent; Service occupations, 16 percent; Production, transportation, and material moving occupations, 6 percent; and Farming, fishing, and forestry occupations, less than 0.5 percent. Twenty-six percent of the people employed were Private wage and salary workers; 74 percent was Federal, state, or local government workers; and less than 0.5 percent was Self-employed in own not incorporated business workers.

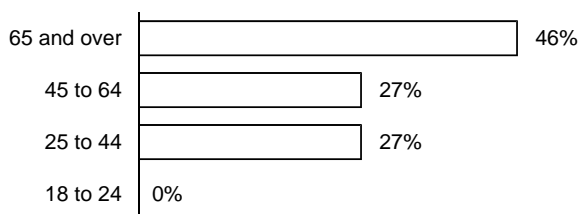
TRAVEL TO WORK: Fifty-five percent of Kalawao County workers drove to work alone in 2005-2009, 8 percent carpooled, less than 0.5 percent took public transportation, and 24 percent used other means. The remaining 13 percent worked at home. Among those who commuted to work, it took them on average 5.7 minutes to get to work.

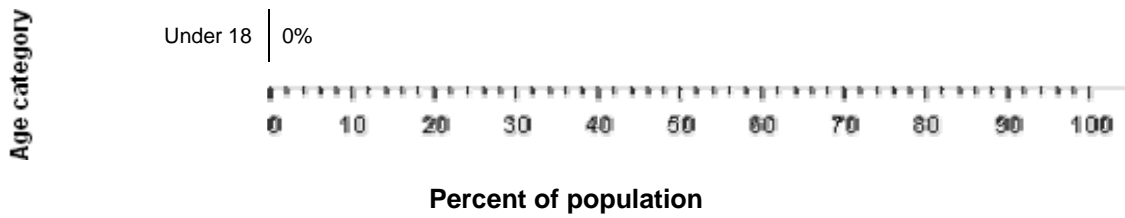
INCOME: The median income of households in Kalawao County was \$52,813. Ninety-six percent of the households received earnings and 18 percent received retirement income other than Social Security. Thirty-one percent of the households received Social Security. The average income from Social Security was \$8,223. These income sources are not mutually exclusive; that is, some households received income from more than one source.

POPULATION OF Kalawao County: In 2005-2009, Kalawao County had a total population of 78 - 37 (47 percent) females and 41 (53 percent) males. The median age was 63.6 years. Less than 0.5 percent of the population was under 18 years and 46 percent was 65 years and older.

The Age Distribution of People in Kalawao County, Hawaii in 2005-2009



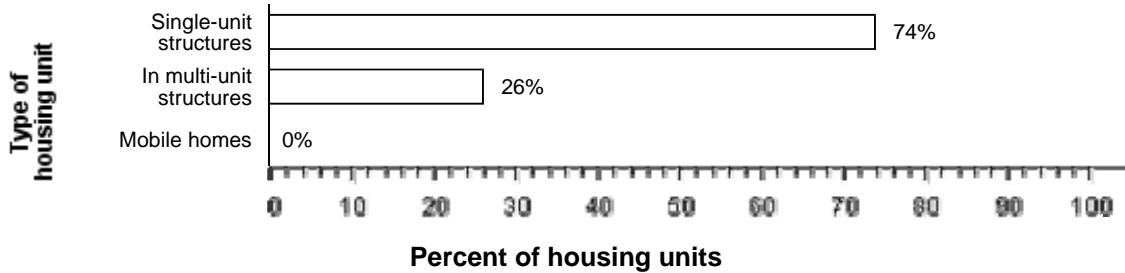

For people reporting one race alone, 27 percent was White; less than 0.5 percent was Black or African American; 4 percent was American Indian and Alaska Native; 19 percent was Asian; 17 percent was Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander, and less than 0.5 percent was Some other race. Thirty-three percent reported Two or more races. Less than 0.5 percent of the people in Kalawao County was Hispanic. Twenty-seven percent of the people in Kalawao County was White non-Hispanic. People of Hispanic origin may be of any race.

HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Kalawao County had a total of 140 housing units, 48 percent of which were vacant. Of the total housing units, 74 percent was in single-unit structures, 26 percent was in multi-unit structures, and less than 0.5 percent was mobile homes. Two percent of the housing units were built since 1990.

OCCUPIED HOUSING UNIT CHARACTERISTICS: In 2005-2009, Kalawao County had 71 occupied housing units - less than 0.5 (less than 0.5 percent) owner occupied and 71 (100 percent) renter occupied. Less than 0.5 percent of the households did not have telephone service and 4 percent of the households did not have access to a car, truck, or van for private use. Multi Vehicle households were not rare. Thirty-one percent had two vehicles and another 20 percent had three or more.
