Highlights for the State of Hawaii

The U.S. Census Bureau released income, poverty, health insurance, computer, internet access and other data from its American Community Survey (ACS) for 2013 on September 18, 2014.

The Census Bureau releases 1-year data for areas with a population size of 65,000 and above. About 2.0% of Hawaii's population were surveyed during 2013.

New in the 2013 ACS

This 1-year ACS data now contains information for the new Metropolitan and Micropolitan Statistical Areas. The Kahului-Wailuku-Lahaina Metropolitan Statistical Area in our State of Hawaii appears for the first time in the ACS data, with a population of 160,292.

Data for computer ownership and Internet use also made its debuts this year.

State Data

In 2013, the **median household income** for Hawaii was \$68,020, not statistically different from the 2012 median income of \$67,053. Hawaii ranked 4th in the nation in regard to the highest median household incomes.

Hawaii's **median family income** was \$80,316 and was not statistically different from last year's median value of \$78,733. Among all states in the nation, Hawaii had the 6^{th} highest median family income.

The **percent of people in poverty** fell from 11.6% in 2012 to 10.8% in 2013, but this decrease was statistically different. The State of Hawaii ranked as the 47th lowest in the nation for percent of people in poverty.

The decrease for **percent of families in poverty** was, however, statistically different with 8.6% in 2012 to 7.1% in 2013.

The **percent of population with no health insurance coverage** among Hawaii's civilian population was 6.7% in 2013, not statistically different from the 6.9% for 2012. Hawaii tied with D.C. for the second lowest percentage of health insurance coverage in the nation.

Hawaii's **median housing value** increased from \$496,600 in 2012 to \$500,000 in 2013. This increase, however, was not statistically different. Hawaii remained #1 in the ranking with the highest median housing value in the U.S.

The median housing costs for owners with a mortgage fell slightly from \$2,273 in 2012 to \$2,220 in 2013. This difference was not statistically different, though.

Among Hawaii's households, 86.4% **had a computer in their home** (e.g. desktop, laptop, tablet or smartphone). For the entire U.S., 83.8% had household computers.

In Hawaii, 79.6 % of households had **some form of Internet access.** This percentage is higher than the U.S. average of 74.4%.

County data

Honolulu County had the highest **median household income** at \$73,388 in 2013. Hawaii County had the lowest median household income at \$48,399. Kauai County's median household income was \$60,155 while Maui County had a median household income of \$65,558.

Honolulu County also had the highest **median family income** at \$85,608 in 2013 and Hawaii County had the lowest median family income at \$56,131. Maui County's median family income was \$79,411 and Kauai County's median family income was \$72,430.

Honolulu County had the lowest **percentage of persons with no health insurance coverage** in 2013 at 5.4% and Hawaii County had the highest percentage at 10.6%. Maui County's figure was 8.9% and Kauai County was at 9.0%.

The **percentage of persons living under poverty** was the lowest in Honolulu County where 9.4% of the county's residents were under the poverty level in 2013, while Hawaii County had the highest poverty rate at 19.5%. The remaining counties were Maui County with 9.5% of persons below the poverty rate and Kauai County with 10.1%.

Hawaii County had the highest **homeownership** at 66.0% in 2013, followed by Kauai County at 61.7%. Maui County had a homeownership rate of 59.1%, while Honolulu County had the lowest homeownership at 53.2%.

Median housing value was the highest on Oahu at \$573,800 in 2013, followed by Kauai County at \$498,300. Median housing value on Maui was \$471,800 while Hawaii County had the lowest median housing value at \$291,900 per unit in 2013.

Median housing cost for owners with a mortgage was the highest in Honolulu County at \$2,362 per month in 2013, followed by Maui County at \$2,261 per month, Kauai County at \$2,022, and Hawaii County at \$1,637 per month.

Oahu renters paid the highest **median rent** in 2013 at \$1,535 per month, followed by Maui County renters at \$1,292 per month, Kauai County renters at \$1,281, and Hawaii County renters with the lowest rent at \$1,017 per month.

87.8 percent of the homes in Honolulu County **had a computer** (e.g. desktop, laptop, tablet or smartphone) while 82.2% of Hawaii County households had this computer access. Kauai County's figure was 84.1% and Maui County's figure was 84.5%

Honolulu County had the highest **percentage of households with some form of Internet access** with 81.0%. The county with the next highest figure was Maui County at 78.0%, followed by Kauai County at 77.7% and, lastly, Hawaii County at 75.0%.

(Although the Census Bureau provided preset tables on the statistical difference for the state trend data discussed in the earlier part of these highlights, no such tables were available for the data between counties. Therefore, there were no mention of the statistical difference in the above section.)
