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HIGHLIGHTS OF THE 2019-2023 AMERICAN COMMUNITY SURVEY 5-YEAR DATA FOR HAWAII

The U.S. Census Bureau <u>released</u> its 2019-2023 American Community Survey (ACS) 5-year estimates on December 12, 2024. A total of 43,211 households in Hawaii were surveyed between the 2019 to 2023 period, which is 8,642 households per year on average. The households surveyed during this five-year period were 8.8% of total households in Hawaii during the period.

The Census Bureau included several new tables with this release. New housing tables provide housing costs as a percentage of household income by race and insurance costs of homeowners by mortgage status. More information on the new tables can be found here.

Selected small area rankings

From this release, census tract ranking tables were created for fourteen topics including total population, average household and family sizes, median incomes, poverty rates, homeownership and housing value, educational attainment, foreign born populations, and populations who speak a language other than English at home. These ranking tables are based on the 424 census tracts in Hawaii which had a population during the 2019-2023 period. The following tables are a subset of the ranking tables available. For reference, state and county estimates are also included. The numbers presented below are averages over the 2019-2023 period. Tables included in these highlights display only the top-ranking census tracts. For the complete list and for the margin of errors, see the accompanying Excel file.

Civilian unemployment rate

The State of Hawaii had a civilian unemployment rate of 5.0%. Hawaii County had the highest rate of unemployment at 6.2% and Kauai County had the lowest at 3.9%.

Fourteen census tracts had a civilian unemployment rate at least 15.0%. Eleven tracts were on Oahu, two were on the island of Hawaii, and one was on Maui. The Navy Exchange Mall was the tract with the highest civilian unemployment rate in the state at 32.6%.

Foreign-born population

Approximately 18.1% of the state of Hawaii's population was foreign-born. At the county level, Honolulu County had the most foreign born and Kauai County had the least.

Ten census tracts had a foreign-born population of at least 50.0% with the top twenty tracts on all on Oahu. At the top of the list was Palama, where the tract's population was largely foreign-born.

Non-English speakers at home

About a quarter of the State's population spoke a language other than English at home. In Honolulu County, more than a quarter of the population spoke a language other than English at home. People speaking a non-English language at home was the least frequent in Kauai County. There were 26 tracts in which most of the area's population, 50% or more, spoke a non-English language at home. These tracts were mostly in Honolulu County, with 72.3% of Palama's population speaking non-English at home.

People with Higher Education

Of the State's population age 25 and over, 35.5% had a bachelor's degree or higher. About 37.7% of the population aged 25 and over in Honolulu County had a bachelor's degree or higher, whereas the other counties had between 30.0% and 31.0%. Over three quarters of the population in the Portlock area had a bachelor's degree or higher, the highest percentage of people in a tract with higher education.
