

Filipino Population in Hawaii:2020

Introduction

Understanding the demographics of an area is crucial for answering many fundamental questions. Governments and organizations utilize this information to comprehend the unique needs of different racial groups and to develop targeted policies. Businesses may use these data to identify potential markets and understand consumer preferences. This report was prepared to provide a precise and extensive understanding of Filipino population living in Hawaii in 2020, based on data from the U.S. Census Bureau's 2020 Decennial Census.

Data in this report are presented under two race definitions: "race alone" and "race alone or in combination". "Race alone" refers to individuals who reported only one race (e.g., full Filipino). "Race alone or in combination" represents all individuals who reported that race, whether as a single identity or combined with other races (e.g., full or part Filipino). It should be noted that the sum of all "race alone or in combination" categories will exceed the total population because these categories are not mutually exclusive. For instance, an individual who reported both Filipino and Chinese would be included in the "Filipino in combination" category and the "Chinese in combination" category.

The tables in the distribution section offer a dual perspective on the population data, providing both the absolute number of individuals in a racial group and their percentages of the total population. The absolute number is useful for understanding the scale and volume of people within a specific geographic area, which is vital for effective policy planning and resource allocation. Percentages, on the other hand, are essential for identifying racial diversity and concentration, serving as a crucial comparative metric that enables stakeholders to assess the relative representation of a group in an area.

The small-area analysis in this report uses the U.S. Census Bureau's geographic level of census tracts. The 2020 Census included 436 census tracts in Hawai'i, four of which had no population. Hawaii's populated census tracts are distributed as follows: 326 in Honolulu County, 43 in Hawai'i County, 45 in Maui and Kalawao Counties, and 18 in Kaua'i County. Populations within these census tracts ranged from 1 to 11,046 people.

The present report is a part of the 2020 Census racial group report series being released by the Hawaii Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism (DBEDT).

Data Source

The data in this report stems from the [2020 Decennial Census: Detailed Demographic Housing Characteristics File A](#) which originally released on September 21st, 2023. In this release were detailed counts and sex-by-age statistics for detailed racial and ethnic groups such as Filipino, Chinese, and Japanese.

Filipinos in Hawaii Population

Table 1 presents the top 25 largest race groups in Hawaii in 2020 for two race definitions: “race alone” and “race alone or in combination with other race(s)”. Reflecting the prevalence of multiracial identities in Hawaii, the “race alone or in combination” figures are substantially higher than the figures for “race alone” for almost all races included in the table.

In 2020, there were 223,205 people in the Filipino “race alone” group statewide, comprising 15.3 percent of total Hawaii population. The size of the Filipino population was much bigger if the Filipinos in combination with other races are included. Including the Filipinos alone or in combination with other races, there were 383,200 Filipinos and this was 26.3 percent of total Hawaii population in that year. For both “race alone” and “race alone or in combination” definitions, Filipino was the 2nd largest race group in Hawaii in 2020.

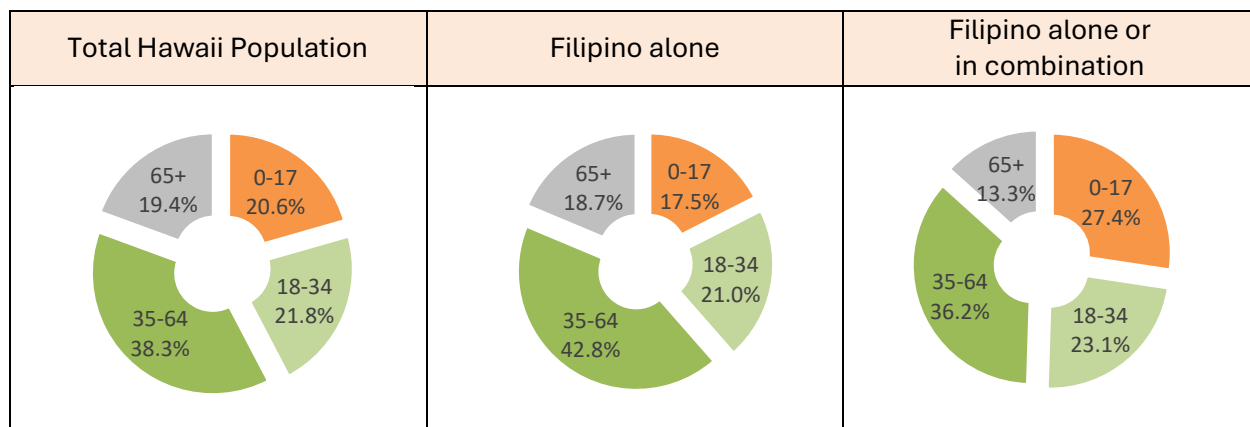

Filipino Population: Sex and Age Composition

Compared with Hawaii overall population, the age structure of Filipino alone population was more concentrated among prime working-age adults (35-64). This group accounted for 42.8 percent of the Filipino alone population in 2020, noticeably higher than 38.3 percent statewide. Both the younger (0-17, 17.5 percent) and older (65+, 18.7 percent) age groups represented slightly smaller proportions than the state averages.

Reflecting the strong presence of households in family-forming and child-bearing stages among mixed Filipino populations, the age profile shifts noticeably younger when Filipinos in combination with other races are included. More than a quarter (27.4 percent) of this broader Filipino group were under age 18-substantially higher than the statewide share for that age range-while only 13.3 percent were age 65 and over, well below the state average.

The 2020 Census showed that Hawaii's Filipino population was slightly more female leaning overall: about 91 males per 100 females in the Filipino alone population, and about 95 males per 100 females in the Filipino alone or in combination group. As in Hawaii overall and U.S. population, the sex ratio varied by age - more males at younger ages and more females at older ages.

Among children and school-age (0-17) and young adults (18-34), males slightly outnumbered females. In contrast, among the older population (65+) the ratio shifted substantially, with roughly three males for every four females. These patterns were evident in both the Filipino alone group and the Filipino alone or in combination group.

The share of mixed-race Filipinos within the Filipino alone or in combination group differed substantially by age. Filipino children were much more likely to be multiracial: 62.8 percent of children and school-age Filipinos (0-17) were Filipino in combination with one or more other races.

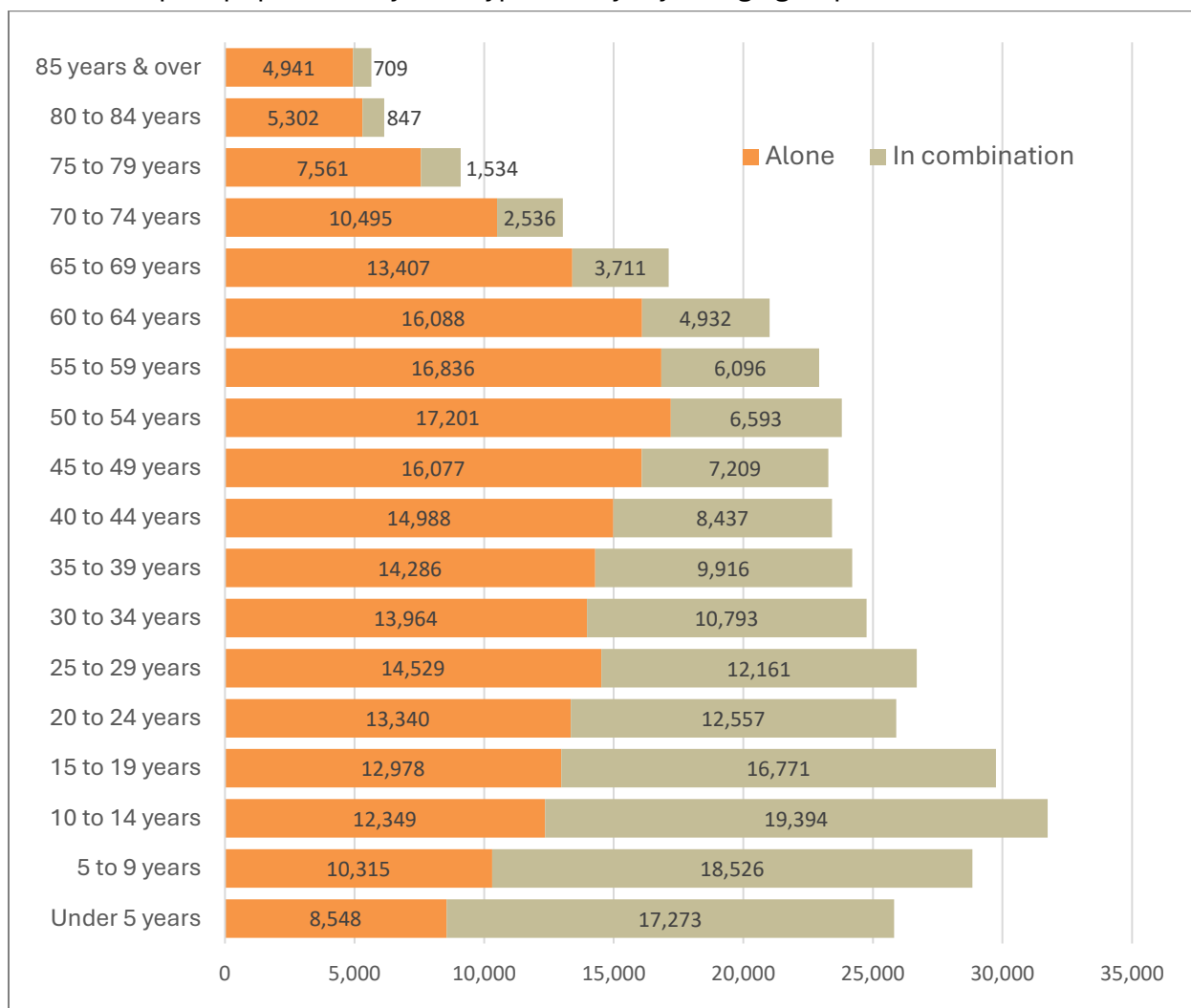
In contrast, older Filipinos were predominantly Filipino alone. Fewer than one in five individuals age 65 and older (18.3 percent) and fewer than one in three age 35-64 (31.1 percent) identified as Filipino in combination with other races.

Among young adults (18-34), the distribution was almost even, with 53.1 percent identifying as Filipino alone and 46.9 percent identifying as Filipino in combination.

Distribution of Filipino Population

Statewide, the proportion of “Filipino alone or in combination” was significantly higher than the proportion of “Filipino alone”, and this pattern was consistently observed across all counties in the 2020 Decennial Census data. However, the data also revealed varied distribution of Filipino population across Hawaii.

Kauai County stands out with the highest proportions of Filipino population at 17.5 percent for “race alone” and 31.9 percent for “race alone or in combination”. The proportion of Filipinos in Maui County was as high as in Kauai County for Filipino alone population, but the proportion of Filipino alone or in combination was noticeably lower in Maui County than in Kauai County. However, Lanai Island, one of the islands in Maui County, had a remarkable 42.4 percent of its population identifying them as Filipino alone, and 61.7 percent identifying as Filipino alone or in combination. Conversely, the dominance of Filipino population was significantly lower in Hawaii County. Only 8.2 percent of the population in Hawaii County identified them as “Filipino alone”. Including “Filipino in combination”, still about one fifth of population in Hawaii County were Filipinos.

Island totals are calculated by aggregating data from all census tracts within each island and may not be accurate due to the noise applied to protect confidentiality.

Tables 5 and 6 display the top 10 census tracts with the largest Filipino alone populations and highest percentage of Filipino alone in the population. Among the top 10 largest Filipino alone population tracts, 4 of them were in Waipahu. The largest population of Filipino alone population was in Waipahu District Park; three other tracts among the top 10, St. Joseph School, Waipahu Uka Neiborhood Park, and Robinson Heights, were also in Waipahu. The second largest Filipino alone population was in the Umi Street tract in the Urban Honolulu Kalihi area. Other tracts in Kalihi among the top 10 are Kamanaiki Street and Kalihi Waena. West Papa Ave. and Lahainaluna were tracts among the top 10 that were the only ones not on the island of Oahu.

Census tracts with the highest percentage of the Filipino race alone group were in many of the same areas as those with the largest Filipino race alone populations. Seven of the top 10 were in the Waipahu area. Three census tracts, Umi Street, Kalihi Waena and Gulick Avenue-Likelike, were in Kalihi.

Tables 7 and 8 display the top 10 census tracts with the largest Filipino alone or in combination populations and highest percentage of Filipino alone or in combination in the population. Much of the top tracts with the largest Filipino alone or in combination population were similar to the largest top tracts of the Filipino alone population. Waipahu District Park ranked 1st again with the largest Filipino race alone or in combination population in Hawaii. However, not included in the top 10 Filipino alone was the Lihue-Kukui Grove Mall tract in Kauai, which had the 5th largest Filipino alone or in combination population.

The top 10 census tracts with the highest percentages of Filipino alone or in combination population were again mostly in Waipahu and Kalihi. When accounting for the Filipino alone or in combination, Filipinos made up 84.4 percent of the Waipahu District Park tract. Farrington Highway-Leoku Street and Paiwa Street-Hiapo Street in Waipahu, and Umi Street in Kalihi were among the top 10 tracts in which their population was comprised of more than 80 percent Filipino. Ranked 9th, Fort-Weaver Road-Renton Road, was the only tract not located in Waipahu or Kalihi that ranked among the top 10.
