Introduction

Understanding the demographics of an area is crucial for answering many fundamental questions. Governments and organizations utilize this information to comprehend the unique needs of different racial groups and to develop targeted policies. Businesses may use these data to identify potential markets and understand consumer preferences. This report was prepared to provide a precise and extensive understanding of Korean population living in Hawaii in 2020, based on data from the U.S. Census Bureau's 2020 Decennial Census.

Data in this report are presented under two race definitions: "race alone" and "race alone or in combination". "Race alone" refers to individuals who reported only one race (e.g., full Korean). "Race alone or in combination" represents all individuals who reported that race, whether as a single identity or combined with other races (e.g., full or part Korean). It should be noted that the sum of all "race alone or in combination" categories will exceed the total population because these categories are not mutually exclusive. For instance, an individual who reported both Korean and Chinese would be included in the "Korean in combination" category and the "Chinese in combination" category.

The tables in the distribution section offer a dual perspective on the population data, providing both the absolute number of individuals in a racial group and their percentages of the total population. The absolute number is useful for understanding the scale and volume of people within a specific geographic area, which is vital for effective policy planning and resource allocation. Percentages, on the other hand, are essential for identifying racial diversity and concentration, serving as a crucial comparative metric that enables stakeholders to assess the relative representation of a group in an area.

The small-area analysis in this report uses the U.S. Census Bureau's geographic level of census tracts. The 2020 Census included 436 census tracts in Hawai'i, four of which had no population. Hawaii's populated census tracts are distributed as follows: 326 in Honolulu County, 43 in Hawai'i County, 45 in Maui and Kalawao Counties, and 18 in Kaua'i County. Populations within these census tracts ranged from 1 to 11,046 people.

The present report is a part of the 2020 Census racial group report series being released by the Hawaii Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism (DBEDT).

Data Source

The data in this report stems from the [2020 Decennial Census: Detailed Demographic Housing Characteristics File A](#) which originally released on September 21st, 2023. In this release were detailed counts and sex-by-age statistics for detailed racial and ethnic groups such as Filipino, Chinese, and Japanese.

Koreans in Hawaii Population

Table 1 presents the top 25 largest race groups in Hawaii in 2020 for two race definitions: “race alone” and “race alone or in combination with other race(s)”. Reflecting the prevalence of multiracial identities in Hawaii, the “race alone or in combination” figures are substantially higher than the “race alone” figures for almost all races included in the table.

In 2020, the Korean “race alone” group consisted of 23,398 individuals, accounting for 1.6 percent of Hawaii’s total population. While the population size increased significantly when including those who identified as Korean in combination with other races, the group remains a smaller demographic compared to the state's largest racial groups. The broader “alone or in combination” group totaled 52,696 individuals, representing 3.6 percent of the state’s population. In the context of Hawaii's diverse racial landscape, Koreans ranked as the 7th largest "race alone" group and the 6th largest group under the "alone or in combination" definition in 2020.

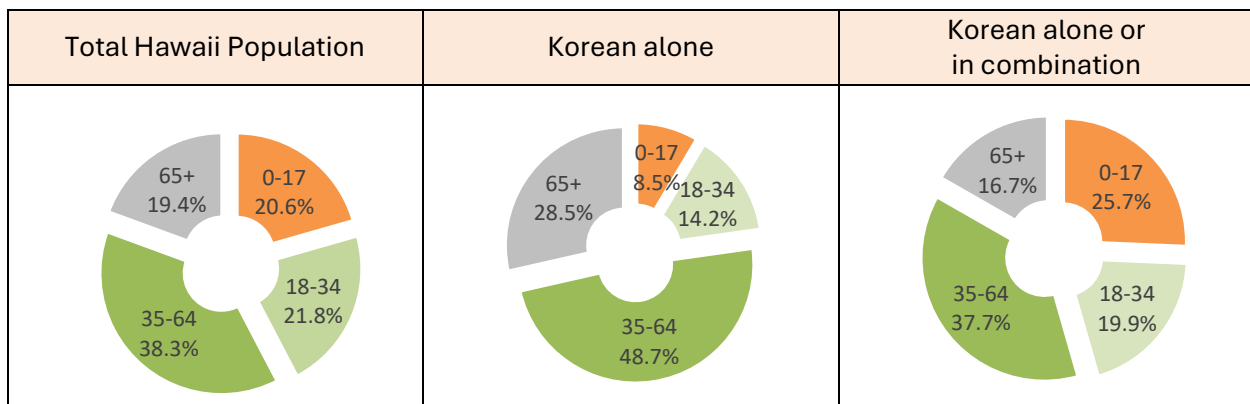

Korean Population: Sex and Age Composition

The Korean alone population in Hawaii exhibited an age profile that was notably older than the state's general population. While prime working-age adults (ages 35–64) represented the largest demographic segment at 48.7 percent, the group was characterized by a significant skew toward older residents. In 2020, the proportion of seniors (ages 65 and older) was 28.5 percent—nearly 10 percentage points higher than the statewide average of 19.4 percent. In contrast, the share of children and school-age individuals (ages 0–17) was only 8.5 percent, which was less than half of the state's overall share of 20.6 percent.

This age profile shifted noticeably younger when considering the broader Korean "alone or in combination" demographic. More than a quarter (25.7 percent) were under the age of 18, a share that exceeded the statewide average. Conversely, the proportion of seniors (ages 65 and older) in this broader group was 16.7 percent, falling below the state average of 19.4 percent.

Consistent with broader trends in Hawaii and the United States, the sex ratio of the Korean population in Hawaii varied by age, typically showing more males at younger ages and more females at older ages. However, a unique feature of Koreans in Hawaii was a severely female-leaning population structure. In 2020, there were approximately 61 males per 100 females within the Korean alone population. While this ratio becomes more balanced when including those identifying as Korean in combination with other races, it remained notably female-dominant at 81 males per 100 females. This disparity is primarily driven by significant female dominance among working-age adults (ages 35–64) and seniors (ages 65 and over) within the Korean alone group, where the number of males was about half that of females.

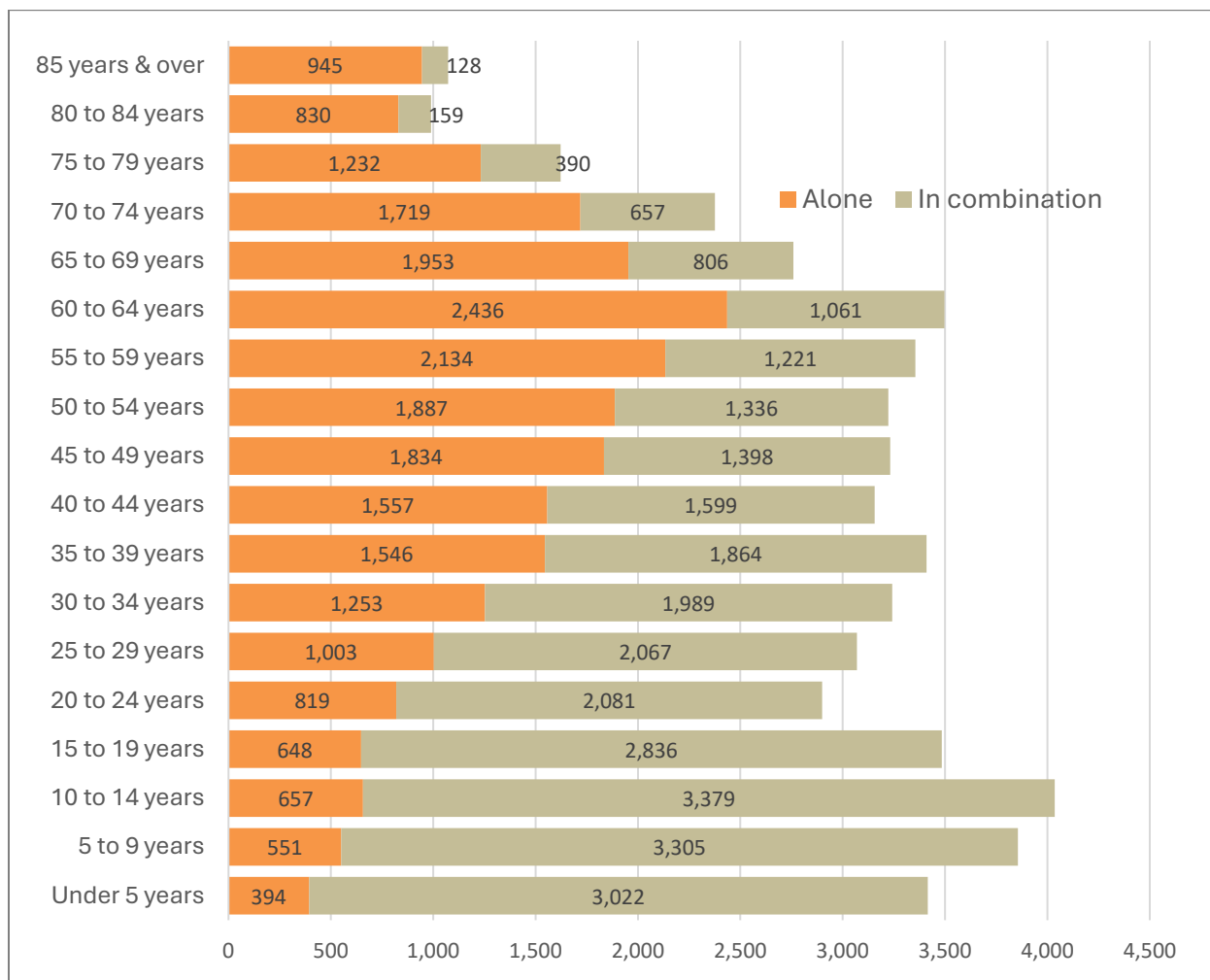
The share of multiracial individuals within the Korean "alone or in combination" group varied substantially by age, with a significantly higher proportion of mixed-race identification found among younger generations. In 2020, more than four in five children and school-age individuals (ages 0–17) were multiracial, accounting for 85.2 percent of that age group. This multiracial majority remained prominent among young adults (ages 18–34), where approximately two-thirds (68.3 percent) identified as Korean in combination with other races.

In contrast, older Korean residents were predominantly identified as Korean alone. Fewer than half of individuals in the 35–64 age range (42.7 percent) and only about one-quarter of seniors aged 65 and older (24.3 percent) identified as Korean in combination with other races. These figures highlight a distinct generational divide, where the prevalence of multiracial identity increases significantly among younger age cohorts.

Distribution of Korean Population

The Korean population in Hawaii was heavily concentrated within Honolulu County. In 2020, nearly 92 percent of individuals identifying as Korean alone resided on the island of Oahu, accounting for 21,439 of the state's 23,398 Korean alone residents. When including those who identified as Korean in combination with other races, Honolulu County remained the primary hub, housing 85.7 percent of the state's total Korean population. Despite this concentration, the group remained a relatively small demographic even in its most concentrated county; the Korean alone group accounted for 2.1 percent of Oahu's residents, while the alone or in combination group represented 4.4 percent of the county's total population.

The neighbor islands hosted significantly smaller Korean populations, representing only 1 to 2 percent of each county's total population, even when multiracial individuals were included. Hawaii County recorded 899 individuals identifying as Korean alone and 3,610 in the broader combined category. This was followed by Maui County, with 870 individuals in the alone category and 3,075 in the broader group, and Kauai County, which reported 174 identifying as Korean alone and 903 in the alone or in combination group.

Island totals are calculated by aggregating data from all census tracts within each island and may not be accurate due to the noise applied to protect confidentiality.

Tables 5 and 6 highlight the geographic clustering of the Korean community, showing that the ten census tracts with the largest Korean alone populations were located exclusively on Oahu. A significant majority of these—seven in total—were concentrated within a specific urban corridor encompassing Midtown Ala Moana, Ala Moana, and Kakaako. This central hub included Kakaako Waterfront Park, which ranked first in population size, followed by the Kaheka Street-Makaloa Street (second) and Ahana Street (third) tracts. Other prominent tracts within this corridor included Ward Village Shops, Kapiolani Boulevard-Cooke Street, the Hawaii Convention Center, and the Ala

Moana Shopping Center. The proximity of these high-ranking tracts underscores the demographic importance of Honolulu's urban core to the Korean community in 2020.

The tracts with the highest concentrations (percentages) of Korean alone residents largely mirrored those with the largest total numbers, though the density levels varied. For example, within tracts having a total population of approximately 2,000 residents, the Kaheka Street-Makaloa Street area showed a particularly high density at 20.5 percent, whereas the Hawaii Convention Center tract followed at 14.3 percent. In larger tracts with roughly 4,000 total residents, Kakaako Waterfront Park maintained a lead with a 15.6 percent concentration. Meanwhile, the Makiki Fire Station and Honolulu Country Club tracts reported more moderate concentrations of 9.5 percent and 9.1 percent, respectively.

The census tracts with the largest Korean alone or in combination populations, as shown in Table 7, remained nearly identical to the list for the "alone" population, with Kapolei emerging as the sole new addition to the top ten. Kakaako Waterfront Park again held the top rank for this broader demographic. Notably, while the Honolulu Country Club tract ranked sixth for the "alone"

population, it rose to second place when multiracial individuals were included, suggesting a higher presence of multiracial Korean households in that specific area.

Overall, the composition of the top ten tracts for both "alone" and "alone or in combination" groups was very similar. The top seven tracts maintained identical rankings across both definitions, and the bottom three—Ala Moana Shopping Center, Honolulu Country Club, and Makiki Fire Station—showed only minor shifts in order. Because the percentage of the population increased only slightly when including multiracial individuals, the data indicated that the Korean community in these top-ranked tracts was predominantly composed of those identifying as Korean alone. This suggests that the multiracial Korean population was more geographically dispersed rather than being concentrated in these specific urban ethnic hubs.
