## *Introduction*

Understanding the demographics of an area is crucial for answering many fundamental questions. Governments and organizations utilize this information to comprehend the unique needs of different racial groups and to develop targeted policies. Businesses may use these data to identify potential markets and understand consumer preferences. This report was prepared to provide a precise and extensive understanding of Native Hawaiian population living in Hawaii in 2020, based on data from the U.S. Census Bureau's 2020 Decennial Census.

Data in this report are presented under two race definitions: "race alone" and "race alone or in combination". "Race alone" refers to individuals who reported only one race (e.g., full Native Hawaiian). "Race alone or in combination" represents all individuals who reported that race, whether as a single identity or combined with other races (e.g., full or part Native Hawaiian). It should be noted that the sum of all "race alone or in combination" categories will exceed the total population because these categories are not mutually exclusive. For instance, an individual who reported both Native Hawaiian and Chinese would be included in the "Native Hawaiian in combination" category and the "Chinese in combination" category.

The tables in the distribution section offer a dual perspective on the population data, providing both the absolute number of individuals in a racial group and their percentages of the total population. The absolute number is useful for understanding the scale and volume of people within a specific geographic area, which is vital for effective policy planning and resource allocation. Percentages, on the other hand, are essential for identifying racial diversity and concentration, serving as a crucial comparative metric that enables stakeholders to assess the relative representation of a group in an area.

The small-area analysis in this report uses the U.S. Census Bureau's geographic level of census tracts. The 2020 Census included 436 census tracts in Hawai'i, four of which had no population. Hawaii's populated census tracts are distributed as follows: 326 in Honolulu County, 43 in Hawai'i County, 45 in Maui and Kalawao Counties, and 18 in Kaua'i County. Populations within these census tracts ranged from 1 to 11,046 people.

The present report is a part of the 2020 Census racial group report series being released by the Hawaii Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism (DBEDT).

### *Data Source*

The data in this report stems from the [2020 Decennial Census: Detailed Demographic Housing Characteristics File A](#) which originally released on September 21<sup>st</sup>, 2023. In this release were detailed counts and sex-by-age statistics for detailed racial and ethnic groups such as Native Hawaiian, Chinese, and Japanese.

## Native Hawaiians in Hawaii Population

Table 1 presents the top 25 largest race groups in Hawaii in 2020 for two race definitions: “race alone” and “race alone or in combination with other race(s)”. Reflecting the prevalence of multiracial identities in Hawaii, the “race alone or in combination” figures are substantially higher than the “race alone” figures for almost all races included in the table.

In 2020, there were 94,025 people in the Native Hawaiian “race alone” group statewide, comprising 6.5 percent of Hawaii’s total population and making it the state’s fourth-largest racial group. However, this figure grew substantially—nearly 3.4 times larger—when including those who identified as Native Hawaiian in combination with other races. Including Native Hawaiians in combination with other races, “ there were 317,497 individuals, comprising 21.8 percent of the total Hawaii population and shifting this demographic to the third-largest racial group in the state.



## Native Hawaiian Population: Sex and Age Composition

The age structure of the Native Hawaiian alone population was generally younger compared to Hawaii's overall population. While the prime working-age adult group (ages 35-64) was the largest demographic at 36.7 percent, the proportion of the children and school-age group (ages 0-17) was significantly higher than the statewide average—27.9 percent compared to 20.6 percent. Conversely, the share of the older age group (ages 65 and older) was notably lower at 14.0 percent, compared to 19.4 percent for the general population.

This youthful age profile was even more pronounced when individuals identifying as Native Hawaiian in combination with other races were included. In 2020, one-third of this broader group (33 percent) consisted of individuals under the age of 18, exceeding the state average by more than 12 percentage points. At the same time, the senior population represented only 10.8 percent of this group – nearly half the statewide proportion of 19.4 percent

The Native Hawaiian population exhibited a relatively well-balanced sex distribution, with a ratio of 1.02 males per female for both the “alone” and “alone or in combination” groups in 2020. As in Hawaii overall and U.S. population, the sex ratio varied by age - more males at younger ages and more females at older ages. Males outnumbered females in every age cohort under 65, with the highest ratio found among children and school-age individuals (1.07). This balance shifted only among senior population (ages 65 and older), where the ratio declined to 0.90 for the alone group and 0.86 for those identifying as Native Hawaiian in combination with other races.


The Native Hawaiian population in Hawaii was predominantly multiracial- a trend that remained consistent across all age group. In 2020, those identifying as Native Hawaiian in combination with other races accounted for nearly three-quarters of the youth population, including 74.9 percent of the children and school-age group (ages 0-17) and 72.8 percent of young adults (ages 18-34).

The multiracial majority persisted among older cohorts as well. Multiracial individuals comprised two-thirds (67.0 percent) of prime working-age adults (ages 35-64) and nearly two-thirds (61.4 percent) of seniors aged 65 and older. Unlike some other ethnic groups in the state where multiracial identification is heavily concentrated in the younger generations, the Native Hawaiian community maintained a high multiracial share across the entire lifespan.

## Distribution of Native Hawaiian Population

Statewide, the proportion of individuals identifying as Native Hawaiian alone or in combination was significantly higher than those identifying as Native Hawaiian alone, a pattern consistently observed across all counties in the 2020 Decennial Census data.

The island of Molokai stood out with the highest proportions of Native Hawaiian population at 33.1 percent for “race alone” and 65.1 percent for “race alone or in combination”. This indicates that nearly one in three Molokai residents identified solely as Native Hawaiian, while roughly two in three identified as Native Hawaiian alone or in combination. Far below Molokai, Hawaii County recorded the second highest concentrations, with 10.1 percent of the county residents identifying as Native Hawaiian alone and 29.6 percent as Native Hawaiian alone or in combination.

On the other hand, the concentrations in Honolulu County and on the island of Lanai fell below the state averages for both race definitions. Specifically, the Native Hawaiian alone population accounted for 6.0 percent of Lanai’s residents and 5.2 percent of Honolulu County’s- figures below the state average of 6.5 percent. Similarly, the broader “alone or in combination” group represented 21 percent on Lanai and 19.7 percent in Honolulu, both figures lower than the state average.

Island totals are calculated by aggregating data from all census tracts within each island and may not be accurate due to the noise applied to protect confidentiality.

Tables 5 and 6 display the top ten census tracts with the largest Native Hawaiian alone populations and the highest percentage of that group within the population. For the largest populations, seven of these tracts contained portions of the Hawaiian Home Lands, while the remaining three (Waianae Valley Road, Maili Beach Park, and Lualualei Transmitter) were located adjacent to tracts containing Home Lands. The Keaukaha-Panaewa census tract in Hilo reported the largest Native Hawaiian alone population in the state. This tract encompasses four Hawaiian Home Lands: Waiakea, Panaewa (both agricultural and residential), and Keaukaha. Notably, two of the three total census tracts on Molokai Island ranked among the top ten largest populations.

All ten census tracts with the highest percentage of the Native Hawaiian alone group contained portions of Hawaiian Home Lands. Five of these tracts were also among the top ten census tracts for total population size, indicating a high concentration of the group in both density and volume in these tracts. Of the tracts ranked by percentage, Makapuu Point ranked first, with slightly over half (51.3 percent) of its population identifying as solely Native Hawaiian. Additionally, two Nanakuli census tracts—containing nearly the entire Nanakuli Hawaiian Home Land—ranked second and third for the highest proportion of the Native Hawaiian alone population.

Tables 7 and 8 display the top ten census tracts with the largest Native Hawaiian alone or in combination populations and the highest percentage of that group within the total population. Many of the top census tracts with the largest Native Hawaiian alone or in combination population were identical to those on the list for the alone population. Driven by its large population and the presence of three Hawaiian Home Lands, Kapolei rose from eighth in the “alone” category to first among the top ten tracts for the “alone or in combination” group.

The top ten census tracts with the highest percentages of the Native Hawaiian alone or in combination population were primarily located in Nanakuli, Waimanalo, and Waianae on Oahu, as well as on Molokai, Niihau, and in Hilo on Hawaii Island. Across all of the top ten census tracts, the proportion of this group was notably high, with at least six out of every ten individuals (61.2 percent) identifying as Native Hawaiian.

The concentration was most intense in the top three tracts—two in Nanakuli (ranked first and second) and the Makapuu Point tract (ranked third). In these areas, proportions ranged from 89.9 to 92.1 percent, indicating that nearly all individuals in these areas identified as Native Hawaiian, either their sole race or in combination with other races.
