The U.S. Census Bureau released its housing unit estimates on May 22, 2014. Below are some statistics on housing units within the State of Hawaii.

On July 1, 2013, Hawaii had 526,257 housing units. This was an increase of 6,749 or a 1.3\% increase from April 1, 2010. Hawaii ranked $42^{\text {nd }}$ in number of housing units among all states within the nation and D.C.

Among our four counties, the City and County of Honolulu had the largest share of housing units with about $65 \%$, followed by Hawaii County with $16 \%$, Maui County with about $14 \%$ and lastly Kauai County with about 6\%.

The housing units increased by 1.3\% in the state between April 1, 2010 and July 1, 2013. Most counties were close to that increase, except for Hawaii County with its $2.6 \%$ increase.
