

Hawaii Housing Facts for July 1, 2018

The U.S. Census Bureau released its July 1, 2018 housing unit estimates on May 23, 2019. Statistics on housing units within the State of Hawaii are below.

On July 1, 2018, Hawaii had 546,213 housing units. This was an increase of 26,700 (5.1%) from April 1, 2010. It represented a 0.6% increase per year. Hawaii ranked 42nd among all states and Washington D.C. in terms of the number of housing units.

Among the four counties, the City and County of Honolulu had the largest share of housing units with 64.5%, followed by Hawaii County with 16.2%, Maui county with 13.5%, and Kauai County with 5.7%.

The number of housing units grew much higher in Hawaii County than the other counties between April 1, 2010 and July 1, 2018. Housing units in Hawaii County increased by 7.6%, while the other counties had a 4.6% - 4.8% increase in housing units.


