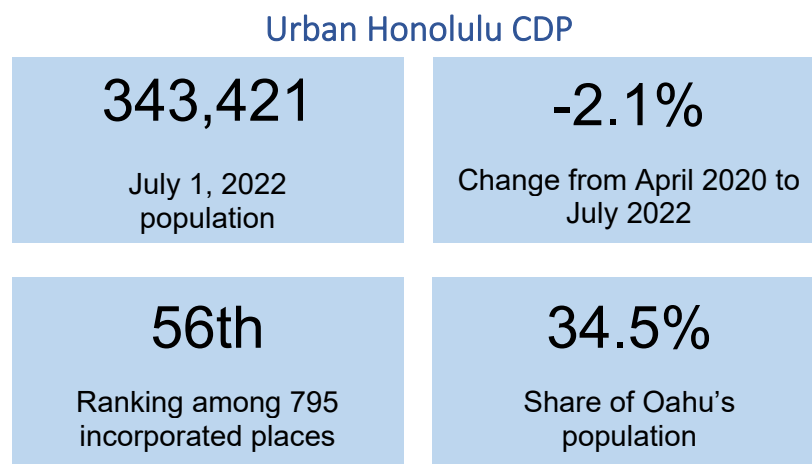


Urban Honolulu CDP Population Estimates for July 1, 2022

The U.S. Census Bureau released its July 1, 2022 subcounty population estimates on May 18, 2023. These annual estimates cover all local governmental units, including incorporated places such as cities and towns.

Hawaii is the only state that has no incorporated places recognized by the U.S. Census. Through an agreement with the Bureau, Urban Honolulu Census Designated Place (CDP) is the only subcounty area in Hawaii for which the Bureau provides population estimates on an annual basis. Urban Honolulu CDP encompasses an area bordered by Nimitz Highway, Aliamanu Drive, Koolau Ridge, Waialae Nui Stream, and Waialae Nui Canal. Statistics for the Urban Honolulu CDP are below.



On July 1, 2022, the Urban Honolulu CDP had a population of 343,421. This was a decrease of 7,545 (2.1%) from April 1, 2020. This was comparable to the rest of the City and County of Honolulu's change in population, which also declined by 2.1% between April 1, 2020 and July 1, 2022.

Urban Honolulu CDP accounted for 34.5% of Oahu's population in 2022, with just under two-thirds of Oahu's population living outside of the Urban Honolulu CDP. Urban Honolulu's share of the population has remained static over several years.

The Urban Honolulu CDP area ranked 56th in population among 795 incorporated places in the U.S. with a population of 50,000 or more in 2022. This ranking is based on population size, with the largest being ranked first. New York City was ranked first as the largest city in the U.S. with a population of 8.3 million people, followed by Los Angeles with a population of 3.8 million people, and Chicago with 2.7 million people. Houston (2.3 million) and Phoenix (1.6 million) rounded out the top five as the largest incorporated places.

Background Information

CDP stands for census-designated place. A CDP is an area identified by the U.S. Census Bureau for statistical purposes. CDPs are delineated for each decennial census as the statistical counterparts of incorporated places such as cities, towns, and villages. CDPs are communities that lack separate municipal government, but which otherwise physically resemble incorporated places. CDPs are delineated to provide data for settled concentrations of population that are identifiable by name but are not legally incorporated under the laws of the state in which they are located. The boundaries of a CDP have no legal status.

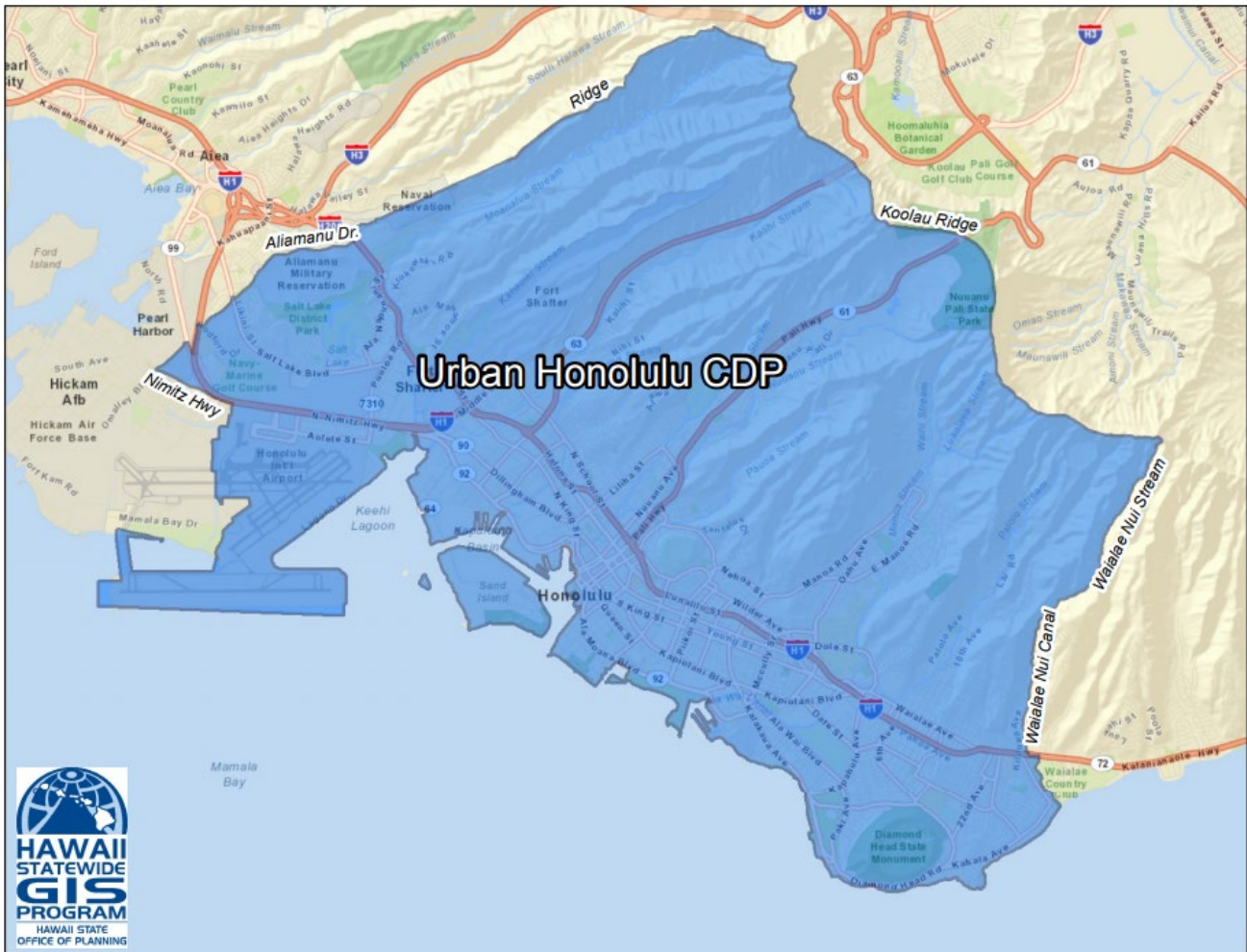
