

“Using DataFerrett” Workshop

The workshop will provide an introduction to the Census Bureau’s DataFerrett a free, online tool that allows users to access and utilize 22 different datasets, including the popular American Community Survey Public Use Microdata Sample. Participants will be taught how to extract, manipulate and analyze data (which includes recoding and doing calculation). Tables (frequencies and cross-tabulations), graphs and maps may be displayed and results exported to various formats such as CVS, PDF, ASCII or HTML.

This tool is the analytical interface to TheDataWeb and allows users to create custom tables and data visualizations such as graphs and thematic maps. DataFerrett may be able to assist you in getting data not available in already existing Census Bureau tables. An example question DataFerrett can help answer is - How many female civil engineers residing on Oahu work in the construction industry?
