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This *Quarterly Statistical and Economic Report* has been prepared by Mary Blewitt, Rene Kamita, and Paul Oshiro with assistance from other staff of the Research and Economic Analysis Division of the State Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism (DBEDT). The report provides concise statistical information and analyses on Labor, Income and Prices, Taxes, Tourism, Construction, and other indicators, as well as an overview of the State of Hawaii and the four counties.

Technical notes and source descriptions have been kept to a minimum. However, the staff of the Research and Economic Analysis Division would be happy to respond to any inquiries of a technical nature that readers may have (586-2466). The quarterly information contained in this report reflects data received by the Research Division on or before December 5, 2023.

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# STATE OF THE ECONOMY

Hawaii's major economic indicators were mixed in the third quarter of 2023. State general fund tax revenues, wage and salary jobs, and private building authorizations increased in the quarter compared to the third quarter of 2022. However, visitor arrivals and government contracts awarded decreased.

In the third quarter of 2023, the total number of visitors arriving by air to Hawaii decreased 102,079 or 4.2 percent and the average daily visitor census decreased 17,925 or 7.4 percent compared to the third quarter of 2022.

In the third quarter of 2023, the construction sector added 400 jobs or 1.1 percent compared with the same quarter of 2022. Government contracts awarded decreased \$692.1 million or 70.1 percent, compared with the same quarter of 2022. In the third quarter of 2023, the permit value for private construction increased \$246.4 million or 31.5 percent. According to the most recent excise tax base data available, construction put-in-place increased \$364.8 million or 13.8 percent in the second quarter of 2023, compared with the same quarter of the previous year. For the first half of 2023, construction put-in-place increased \$480.9 million or 9.2 percent compared with the same period of the previous year.

In the third quarter of 2023, State general fund tax revenues increased \$106.1 million or 4.8 percent over the same period of 2022. The state general excise tax revenue increased \$0.9 million or 0.1 percent, net individual income tax revenues increased \$145.6 million or 22.5 percent, the transient accommodations tax (TAT) decreased \$15.1 million or 6.4 percent, and net corporate income tax revenues decreased \$14.3 million or 17.9 percent. In the first three quarters of 2023, State general fund tax revenues decreased \$134.9 million or 1.8 percent over the same period of the previous year.

Labor market conditions were mixed. In the third quarter of 2023, Hawaii's non-agricultural wage and salary jobs averaged 628,200 jobs, an increase of 9,900 jobs or 1.6 percent from the same quarter of 2022; however, the civilian labor force declined by 6,250 persons or 0.9 percent.

The job increase in the third quarter of 2023 was due to job increases in both the private sector and the government sector. In this quarter, the private sector added about 8,700 non-agricultural jobs compared to the third quarter of 2022. Most of the private sector industries added jobs in the quarter. The number of jobs increased the most in Food Services and Drinking Places, which added 3,300 jobs or 5.1 percent; followed

by Private Educational Services, which added 1,400 jobs or 10.4 percent, Accommodations, which added 1,300 jobs or 3.4 percent, Health Care and Social Assistance, which added 700 jobs or 1.0 percent, and Other Services, which added 700 jobs or 2.6 percent, in the quarter. The Government sector added 1,200 jobs or 1.0 percent in the third quarter of 2023 compared to the same quarter of 2022. The Federal Government added 400 jobs or 1.1 percent, the State Government added 500 jobs or 0.8 percent, and the Local Government added 400 jobs or 2.1 percent, compared to the third quarter of 2022.

In the second quarter of 2023, total annualized nominal GDP increased \$7,710 million or 7.8 percent, from the same quarter of 2022. In the first half of 2023, total annualized nominal GDP increased \$8,182 million or 8.3 percent from the same period of the previous year. In the second quarter of 2023, total annualized real GDP (in chained 2017 dollars) increased \$1,973 million or 2.3 percent from the same quarter of 2022. In the first half of 2023, total annualized real GDP increased \$1,987 million or 2.4 percent from the same period of the previous year.

In the second quarter of 2023, total non-farm private sector annualized earnings increased \$2,911.2 million or 6.7 percent from the same quarter of 2022. In dollar terms, the largest increase occurred in Accommodation and Food Services; followed by Health Care and Social Assistance; and Professional, Scientific and Technical Services. During the second quarter of 2023, total government earnings increased \$680.3 million or 4.0 percent from the same quarter of 2022. Earnings from the federal government increased \$513.7 million. Earnings from the state and local governments increased \$166.6 million in the quarter.

In the first half of 2023, Honolulu's Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers (CPI-U) increased 3.4 percent from the same period in 2022. This is 1.5 percentage points below the 4.9 percent increase for the U.S. average CPI-U and is lower than the first half of 2022 Honolulu CPI-U increase of 6.7 percent from the same period of the previous year. In the first half of 2023, the Honolulu CPI-U increased the most in Apparel (15.6 percent), followed by Other Goods and Services (10.3 percent), Food and Beverages (4.5 percent), Recreation (4.4 percent), Education and Communication (2.7 percent), Housing (2.2 percent), and Transportation (1.7 percent) compared to the first half of 2022.

# **OUTLOOK FOR THE ECONOMY**

The August 8, 2023 Maui wildfires have had a significant impact on the State's economy. The impacts are most pronounced for Maui County. Between August 2023 and October 2023, visitor arrivals by air to Maui County decreased 51.4 percent compared to the same period in 2022. Total visitor arrivals by air to the state decreased by 6.2 percent during this three-month period.

The number of unemployed persons (not seasonally adjusted) in Maui County increased by 87.1 percent for the period August 2023 through October 2023 compared to the same period in 2022. Maui County's unemployment rate (not seasonally adjusted) in October 2023 was 7.1 percent. The statewide unemployment rate (not seasonally adjusted) in October 2023 was 3.1 percent, half of a percentage point lower than the national average.

During the three months between August and October 2023, state general excise tax collection decreased 1.7 percent from the same period in 2022.

The impacts of the Maui wildfires on the State's economic indicators to date are mitigated by Hawaii's strong economic performance through July 2023. Total visitor arrivals for the first ten months of 2023 increased by 5.5 percent compared to the same period in 2022. The state added 2.6 percent more non-agricultural payroll jobs (not seasonally adjusted) in the first ten months of 2023 compared to the same period in 2022. The state's unemployment rate (not seasonally adjusted) through the first ten months of 2023 averaged 3.0 percent, half of a percentage point lower than the same period in 2022 and 0.4 percentage point higher compared to the same period in 2019.

The total value of private building permits issued during the first ten months of 2023 increased by 4.2 percent from the same period a year ago. The permit value for additions and alterations increased by 25.3 percent, the value for commercial and industrial permits increased by 9.5 percent, and the value of residential permits decreased by 12.6 percent.

As a comprehensive measure of economic activity, the general excise tax revenue collections increased by 5.1 percent in the first ten months of 2023 compared to the same period in 2022.

Hawaii's real gross domestic product (GDP) recovered to 97.7 percent in the second quarter of 2023 compared to the same period in 2019.

The most recent economic projections at the national level, by the top 50 economic forecasting organizations, published in Blue Chip Economic Indicators (November 10, 2023), indicate that U.S. economic growth is expected to be 2.4 percent in 2023 and 1.2 percent in 2024. DBEDT estimates that the state's real GDP will increase by 1.9 percent in 2023 and 1.3 percent in 2024. In 2025 and 2026, economic growth for Hawaii is expected to be 1.9 percent and 2.0 percent respectively.

Visitor arrivals are projected to be 9.6 million in 2023, lower than previously projected. Visitor arrivals are now expected to increase to over 10 million from 2025 instead of 2024. Visitor spending is projected to be \$20.9 billion in 2023 and is expected to increase to \$23.5 billion by 2026.

Non-agriculture payroll jobs are forecast to increase by 2.2 percent in 2023. The payroll job counts are projected to increase by 1.6 percent in 2024, 1.6 percent in 2025, and 1.4 percent in 2026.

The state unemployment rate is forecast to be 3.0 percent in 2023, and will improve to 2.8 percent in 2024, 2.6 percent in 2025, and 2.4 percent in 2026.

Personal income is forecast to grow by 4.5 percent in 2023, higher than the projection made in the previous quarter. Personal income is expected to grow by 3.8 percent in 2024, 4.0 percent in 2025, and 4.2 percent in 2026.

As measured by the Honolulu Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers, inflation is expected to be 2.8 percent in 2023, still lower than the projected U.S. consumer inflation rate of 4.1 percent for the same year. Hawaii consumer inflation is expected to decrease to 2.2 percent by 2026.

Hawaii's population is projected to decrease by 0.2 percent in 2023, decrease by 0.1 percent in 2024, and increase by 0.1 percent in 2025 and in 2026.

# COUNTY ECONOMIC CONDITIONS

As a result of the August 8, 2023 wildfires, Maui County experienced a large decrease in visitor arrivals, lost jobs, and faced a higher unemployment rate in the third quarter of 2023 compared to the same quarter in 2022. Honolulu, Hawaii, and Kauai counties saw an increase in visitor arrivals, gained jobs, and experienced lower unemployment rates during this time. The value of private building permits increased in Honolulu, Maui, and Kauai counties, but decreased in Hawaii County in the third quarter of 2023 compared to the same quarter in 2022.

In the third quarter of 2023, the unemployment rate in Honolulu decreased 0.9 percentage points from 3.6 percent to 2.7 percent; the unemployment rate in Hawaii County decreased 0.9 percentage points from 3.9 percent to 3.0 percent; and the unemployment rate in Kauai County decreased 1.1 percentage points from 3.6 percent to 2.5 percent. The unemployment rate in Maui County increased 1.6 percentage points from 3.4 percent to 5.0 percent.

In the third quarter of 2023, Honolulu added 8,400 or 1.9 percent non-agricultural wage and salary jobs compared to the same quarter of 2022. Jobs increased the most in Food Services & Drinking Places, which added 3,500 jobs or 7.9 percent. This was followed by Accommodation which added 1,200 jobs or 7.4 percent, Private Educational Services which added 1,100 jobs or 10.3 percent, Arts, Entertainment & Recreation which added 800 jobs or 10.8 percent, and Construction which added 700 jobs or 2.6 percent in the quarter. The Government sector added 1,000 jobs or 1.1 percent in the quarter.

In the third quarter of 2023, Hawaii County added 1,900 or 2.8 percent of non-agricultural wage and salary jobs over the same quarter of 2022. Jobs increased the most in Retail Trade, which added 500 jobs or 5.2 percent. This was followed by Private Educational Services which added 300 jobs or 25.0 percent. Transportation, Warehousing & Utilities; Professional & Business

Services; Accommodation; and Food Services & Drinking Places each added 200 jobs in the quarter. The number of Government sector jobs was unchanged.

Maui County lost 500 jobs or a 0.7 percent decrease in the third quarter of 2023 over the same quarter of 2022. Jobs increased the most in Health Care & Social Assistance, which added 200 jobs or 2.5 percent. Construction, Manufacturing, and Arts, Entertainment & Recreation each added 100 jobs. Accommodation and Retail Trade each lost 300 jobs, for a 2.6 percent and 3.3 percent decrease, respectively. The number of Government sector jobs was unchanged in the quarter.

Kauai County added 600 jobs or a 1.9 percent increase in the third quarter of 2023 over the same quarter of 2022. Jobs increased the most in Accommodation, which added 300 jobs or 7.7 percent. Retail Trade, Professional & Business Services, and Other Services each added 200 jobs in the quarter. The Government sector lost 100 jobs or 2.0 percent in the quarter.

In the third quarter of 2023, visitor arrivals by air increased in all counties except Maui County. Visitor arrivals by air decreased 35.9 percent in Maui County compared to the third quarter of 2022. Visitor arrivals by air increased 10.3 percent in Honolulu County, 4.1 percent in Hawaii County, and 6.2 percent in Kauai County compared to the same quarter of 2022.

In the third quarter of 2023, the value of private building permits increased in Honolulu County, Maui County and Kauai County, but decreased in Hawaii County. In the third quarter of 2023, private building permits increased \$201.0 million or 52.2 percent in Honolulu County, \$72.9 million or 50.9 percent in Maui County, and \$8.3 million or 26.4 percent in Kauai County (only residential available). Private building permits decreased \$35.8 million or 16.0 percent in Hawaii County from the same quarter of the previous year.

# A. LABOR FORCE AND JOBS

Hawaii's labor market conditions were mixed in the third quarter of 2023. The civilian labor force declined more than civilian employment, resulting in decreases in civilian unemployment and the unemployment rate. Civilian non-agricultural wage and salary jobs increased.

In the third quarter of 2023, the civilian labor force averaged 673,550 people, a decrease of 6,250 people or 0.9 percent from the same quarter of 2022 (Table A-1). In the first three quarters of 2023, the civilian labor force increased 1,150 people or 0.2 percent from the same period of the previous year.

Civilian employment averaged 653,200 people in the third quarter of 2023, a decrease of 1,800 people or 0.3 percent compared to the same quarter of 2022 (Table A-2). In the first three quarters of 2023, average civilian employment increased 3,950 people or 0.6 percent from the same period of the previous year.

In the third quarter of 2023, the number of civilian unemployed averaged 20,400, a decrease of 4,400 people or 17.7 percent from the same quarter of 2022 (Table A-3). In the first three quarters of 2023, the number of unemployed decreased 2,800 people or 12.1 percent from the same period of the previous year.

The unemployment rate (not seasonally adjusted) was 3.0 percent in the third quarter of 2023, a decrease of 0.7 percentage points from the third quarter of 2022 (Table A-4). In the first three quarters of 2023, the unemployment rate decreased 0.4 percentage points from the previous year's 3.4 percent to 3.0 percent.

In the third quarter of 2023, Hawaii's non-agricultural wage and salary jobs averaged 628,200 jobs, an increase of 9,900 jobs or 1.6 percent from the same quarter of 2022 (Table A-6). In the first three quarters of 2023, average non-agricultural wage and salary jobs increased 2.7 percent or about 16,800 jobs from the same period of the previous year.

The job increase in the third quarter of 2023 was due to job increases in both the private sector and the government sector. In this quarter, the private sector added about 8,700 non-agricultural jobs compared to the third quarter of 2022. Most of the private sector industries added jobs in the quarter. The number of jobs increased the most in Food Services and Drinking Places, which added 3,300 jobs or 5.1 percent (Table A-19); followed by Private Educational Services, which added 1,400 jobs or 10.4 percent (Table A-15), Accommodations, which added 1,300 jobs or 3.4 percent (Table A-18), Health Care and Social Assistance, which added 700 jobs or 1.0 percent (Table A-16), and Other Services, which added 700 jobs or 2.6 percent (Table A-20) in the quarter.

The Government sector added 1,200 jobs or 1.0 percent (Table A-21) in the third quarter of 2023 compared to the same quarter of 2022. The Federal Government added 400 jobs or 1.1 percent (Table A-22), the State Government added 500 jobs or 0.8 percent (Table A-23), and the Local Government added 400 jobs or 2.1 percent (Table A-24), compared to the third quarter of 2022.

# **B. INCOME AND PRICES**

In the second quarter of 2023, total annualized nominal GDP increased \$7,710 million or 7.8 percent, from the second quarter of 2022. In the first half of 2023, total annualized nominal GDP increased \$8,182 million or 8.3 percent from the same period of the previous year. In the second quarter of 2023, total annualized real GDP (in chained 2017 dollars) increased \$1,973 million or 2.3 percent from the second quarter of 2022. In the first half of 2023, total annualized real GDP increased \$1,987 million or 2.4 percent from the same period of the previous year (Tables B-1 to B-3).

Hawaii's total personal income increased during the second quarter of 2023, over the same quarter of 2022; and all components of personal income increased over the same quarter of the previous year.

In the second quarter of 2023, total nominal annualized personal income (i.e., not adjusted for inflation) increased \$4,836.7 million or 5.5 percent over the second quarter of 2022 (Table B-5). In the first half of 2023, personal income was \$92,218.0 million, an increase of \$4,952.3 million or 5.7 percent from the same period of the previous year. In the second quarter of 2023, personal income per capita was \$64,457, a 5.9 percent increase over the same quarter of the previous year (Table B-6).

In the second quarter of 2023, wages and salaries increased \$2,846.8 million or 6.8 percent over the same quarter of 2022. In the first half of 2023, wages and salaries increased \$2,834.2 million or 6.8 percent from the same period of the previous year (Table B-8).

Supplements to wages and salaries, consisting of employer payments to retirement plans, private group health insurance plans, private workers compensation plans, and other such benefits, increased \$587.8 million or 4.9 percent in the second quarter of 2023 from the same quarter of 2022 (Table B-9). In the first half of 2023, supplements to wages and salaries increased \$615.2 million or 5.2 percent from the previous year.

Proprietors' income increased \$219.2 million or 3.4 percent in the second quarter of 2023 over that of 2022 (Table B-10). In the first half of 2023, proprietors' income was up \$106.7 million or 1.6 percent from the same period of the previous year.

Dividends, interest, and rent increased \$1,197.5 million or 6.8 percent in the second quarter of 2023 from the same quarter of 2022 (Table B-11). In the first half of 2023, income in this category was up \$1,374.8 million or 7.9 percent from the same period of the previous year.

The annualized personal current transfer receipts increased \$428.1 million or 2.6 percent in the second quarter of 2023 from the same quarter of 2022 (Table B-12). In the first half of 2023, personal current transfer receipts increased \$478.6 million or 2.9 percent from the same period of the previous year.

Contributions to government social insurance, which is subtracted from total personal income, increased \$442.7 million or 6.2 percent in the second quarter of 2023 compared to the second quarter of 2022 (Table B-13). In the first half of 2023, these contributions increased \$457.2 million or 6.5 percent from the same period of the previous year.

In the second quarter of 2023, total non-farm private sector annualized earnings increased \$2,911.2 million or 6.7 percent from the second quarter of 2022. In dollar terms, the largest increase occurred in Accommodation and Food Services; followed by Health Care and Social Assistance and Professional, Scientific & Technical Services. During the second quarter of 2023, total government earnings increased from the same quarter of 2022. Earnings from the federal government increased \$513.7 million. Earnings from the state and local governments increased \$166.6 million in the quarter.

In the first half of 2023, Honolulu's Consumer Price Index for Urban Consumers (CPI-U) increased 3.4 percent from the same period in 2022 (Table B-14). This is 1.5 percentage points below the 4.9 percent increase for the U.S. average CPI-U. It is also lower than the 6.7 increase in the Honolulu CPI-U for the first half of 2022 compared to the same period of the previous year. In the first half of 2023, the Honolulu CPI-U increased the most in Apparel (15.6 percent), followed by Other Goods and Services (10.3 percent), Food and Beverages (4.5 percent), Recreation (4.4 percent), Education and Communication (2.7 percent), Housing (2.2 percent), and Transportation (1.7 percent) compared to the first half of 2022.

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#### C. TAX REVENUES

The State general fund tax revenues increased in the third quarter of 2023 compared to the same quarter of 2022. Among the components shown, the Net Individual Income Tax increased the most in dollar terms, followed by the General Excise and Use Tax (GET). The Transient Accommodations Tax (TAT) and Net Corporate Income Tax decreased.

In the third quarter of 2023, total tax collections distributed to the State general fund totaled \$2,302.0 million, an increase of \$106.1 million or 4.8 percent over the same quarter of 2022 (Tables C-1 and C-2). In the first three quarters of 2023, State general fund tax revenues decreased \$134.9 million or 1.8 percent over the same period of the previous year.

During the third quarter of 2023, GET revenues (excluding County Surcharges) totaled \$1,124.2 million, an increase of \$0.9 million or 0.1 percent over the same quarter of 2022 (Table C-3). In the first three quarters of 2023, GET revenues increased \$180.1 million or 5.6 percent from the same period of the previous year.

Compared to the third quarter of 2022, Net Individual Income Tax revenues increased \$145.6 million or 22.5 percent to \$792.2 million in the second quarter of 2023 (Table C-4). In the third quarter of 2023, Declaration of Estimated Taxes decreased \$60.7 million or 25.7 percent (Table C-5), Payments with Returns decreased \$6.5 million or 12.9 percent (Table C-6), Revenues from Withholding Tax on Wages increased \$59.9 million or 9.7 percent (Table C-7), and Refunds decreased \$152.9 million or 60.0 percent (Table C-8). In the first three quarters of 2023, Net Individual Income Tax collections decreased \$251.1 million or 8.7 percent from the same period of the previous year.

Net Corporate Income Tax revenues, which tend to be volatile by nature, decreased from \$79.8 million in the third quarter of 2022 to \$65.5 million in the third quarter of 2023, a decrease of \$14.3 million (Table C-9). In the third quarter of 2023, the Declaration of Estimated Taxes decreased \$4.2 million or 5.1 percent (Table C-10), the Payment with Returns decreased \$1.9 million or 32.8 percent (Table C-11), and the Refunds increased \$8.3 million or 113.3 percent (Table C-12), compared with the same quarter of 2022. In the first three quarters of 2023, Net Corporate Income Tax revenues increased \$21.4 million from \$213.9 million for the same period in 2022 to \$235.3 million in 2023, or 10.0 percent.

In the third quarter of 2023, Transient Accommodations Tax (TAT) revenues decreased \$15.1 million, or 6.4 percent compared to the same quarter of 2022 (Table C-13). In the first three quarters of 2023, TAT revenues increased \$20.1 million or 3.1 percent from the same period of the previous year.

According to the most recent data available, in the second quarter of 2023, the Retailing tax base increased 2.5 percent or \$296.9 million (Table C-14), the Services tax base increased 8.4 percent or \$411.9 million (Table C-15), the Contracting tax base increased 13.8 percent or \$364.8 million (Table C-16), and the Hotel Rentals tax base increased 4.2 percent or \$78.0 million (Table C-17), compared to the same quarter of the previous year. For the first half of 2023, the Retailing tax base increased 6.6 percent, the Services tax base increased 9.6 percent, the Contracting tax base increased 9.2 percent, and the Hotel Rentals tax base increased 10.0 percent.

#### D. TOURISM

International visitor arrivals continued to increase while domestic visitor arrivals further decreased in the third quarter of 2023.

The total number of visitor arrivals by air decreased by 102,079 persons or 4.2 percent in the third quarter of 2023, compared to the third quarter of 2022 (Table D-2). The total average daily census decreased by 17,925 persons or 7.4 percent in the quarter. In the first three quarters of 2023, total visitor arrivals by air increased 388,285 or 5.7 percent, while the average daily census increased 6,873 or 3.0 percent compared to the same period of the previous year.

In the third quarter of 2023, total visitor arrivals on domestic flights decreased 228,165 or 10.4 percent compared to the same quarter of 2022 (Table D-3). In the first three quarters of 2023, domestic arrivals were down 141,774 or 2.3 percent compared to the same period of the previous year.

Arrivals on international flights increased 126,086 or 50.0 percent in the third quarter of 2023 compared to the third quarter of 2022 (Table D-4). In the first three quarters of 2023, international arrivals increased 530,059 or 93.1 percent compared to the first three quarters of the previous year.

In terms of major market areas, from the third quarter of 2022 to the same period of 2023, arrivals from the U.S. West decreased 169,763 or 12.2 percent (Table D-5), arrivals from the U.S. East decreased 50,920 or 8.0 percent (Table D-6), and arrivals from Japan increased 90,979 or 117.5 percent (Table D-7). In the first three quarters of 2023, arrivals from the U.S. West were down 177,020 or 4.4 percent; arrivals from the U.S. East were up 786 or 0.04 percent; and Japanese arrivals were up 275,354 or 256.7 percent from the same period of the previous year.

The total average daily visitor census decreased 7.4 percent or 17,925 visitors per day in the third quarter of 2023, over the same quarter of 2022 (Table D-8). The domestic average daily census decreased 11.8 percent

or 25,449 visitors per day (Table D-9), while the international average daily census increased 27.3 percent or 7,524 visitors per day (Table D-10). In the first three quarters of 2023, the domestic average daily census decreased 7,463 or 3.6 percent; and the international average daily census increased by 14,336 or 63.2 percent from the same period of the previous year.

Nominal visitor expenditures by air totaled \$4,997.5 million in the third quarter of 2023, a decrease of \$250.9 million or 4.8 percent from the third quarter of 2022 (Table D-11). In the first three quarters of 2023, visitor expenditures totaled \$15,743.6 million, an increase of \$1,149.2 million or 7.9 percent from the same period of the previous year.

Total airline capacity, as measured by the number of available seats flown to Hawaii, increased 0.6 percent or by 19,794 seats (Table D-12) in the third quarter of 2023, domestic seats decreased 4.1 percent or 116,856 seats (Table D-13), and international seats increased 31.7 percent or 136,650 seats (Table D-14), compared to the same quarter of 2022. In the first three quarters of 2023, the number of total available seats increased 3.7 percent or 356,722 seats, domestic seats increased 3.4 percent or 291,007 seats, and international seats increased 59.0 percent or 647,729 seats compared to the same period of the previous year.

In the third quarter of 2023, the statewide hotel occupancy rate averaged 75.7 percent, 1.5 percentage points lower than that of the same quarter of 2022 (Table D-15). In the first three quarters of 2023, the statewide hotel occupancy rate averaged 75.3 percent, 1.0 percentage point higher than the same period of the previous year.



# E. CONSTRUCTION

The indicators of Hawaii's construction industry were mostly positive in the third quarter of 2023. Construction jobs and State government CIP expenditures increased. Private building authorizations increased in all counties except Hawaii County. Government contracts awarded decreased.

In the third quarter of 2023, the number of jobs in the construction sector increased by 1.1 percent or by 400 jobs compared with the same quarter of 2022. In the first three quarters of 2023, the construction sector added 1,000 jobs or 2.7 percent (Table A-7) from the same period of the previous year.

In the third quarter of 2023, private building authorizations in the state increased \$246.4 million or 31.5 percent, compared with the third quarter of 2022 (Table E-8). In the first three quarters of 2023, private building authorizations in the state increased \$480.0 million or 21.0 percent compared with the same period of the previous year.

In the third quarter of 2023, private building authorizations in Honolulu increased \$201.0 million or 52.2 percent, compared with the third quarter of 2022 (Table E-8). In the first three quarters of 2023, private building authorizations in Honolulu increased \$232.0 million or 19.9 percent, compared with the same period of the previous year.

In the third quarter of 2023, private building authorizations in Hawaii County decreased \$35.8 million or 16.0 percent, compared with the third quarter of 2022 (Table E-8). In the first three quarters of 2023, private building authorizations in Hawaii County increased \$15.6 million or 2.4 percent, compared with the same period of the previous year.

In the third quarter of 2023, private building authorizations in Maui increased \$72.9 million or 50.9 percent, compared with the third quarter of 2022 (Table E-8). In the first three quarters of 2023, private building authorizations in Maui increased \$212.9 million or 55.7 percent compared with the same period of the previous year.

In the third quarter of 2023, private building authorizations (residential only) in Kauai increased \$8.3 million or 26.4 percent, compared with the third quarter of 2022 (Table E-8). In the first three quarters of 2023,

private building authorizations in Kauai County increased \$19.5 million or 20.9 percent compared with the same period of the previous year.

In the third quarter of 2023, government contracts awarded decreased \$692.1 million or 70.1 percent, compared with the third quarter of 2022 (Table E-1). In the first three quarters of 2023, government contracts awarded decreased \$68.0 million or 1.6 percent compared with the same period of the previous year. State government CIP expenditures increased \$11.0 million or 3.3 percent in the third quarter of 2023 compared with the same quarter of 2022. In the first three quarters of 2023, state government CIP expenditures declined \$30.7 million or 3.1 percent from the same period of the previous year (Table E-2).

The Honolulu Construction Cost Index for Single Family Residence (Table E-6) increased 3.0 percent in the third quarter of 2023 compared to the same quarter of 2022 and similarly increased 4.3 percent for High-Rise Building (Table E-7). In the first three quarters of 2023, the index for Single Family Residence increased 3.8 percent and 3.7 percent for High-Rise Building as compared to the same period of the previous year.

Average home prices increased by 3.5 percent in the third quarter of 2023, with single family home prices up by 1.7 percent and condo prices up by 1.7 percent over the same quarter of the previous year (Table E-9). The purchase of homes decreased by 25.6 percent for local buyers, declined 16.6 percent for mainland buyers, and decreased 59.9 percent for foreign buyers over the same quarter of the previous year (Table E-10).

In the third quarter of 2023, Honolulu's median price for single family resales was \$1,073,750, down \$36,750 or 3.3 percent over the same quarter of 2022 (Table E-11). The median price for condominium unit resales was \$511,000, up \$11,000 or 2.2 percent over the same quarter of 2022 (Table E-12). In the third quarter of 2023, the number of single-family unit resales decreased 21.7 percent, and the number of condominium unit resales decreased 19.8 percent, compared with the second quarter of 2022 (Tables E-13 and E-14). In the first three quarters of 2023, the number of single-family unit resales decreased 30.5 percent, and condominium unit resales decreased 31.2 percent compared with the previous year.

# F. OTHER INDICATORS

The total number of bankruptcy filings in Hawaii increased 10.2 percent or by 27 cases for the third quarter of 2023, from the same quarter of 2022. In the first three quarters of 2023, total filings increased 9.8 percent or 71 cases from the same period of the previous year.

The number of Chapter 7 filings, the largest category, increased 12.8 percent or 22 cases in the third quarter of 2023. Chapter 7 filings are intended to liquidate assets and discharge debt. In the first three quarters of 2023, Chapter 7 filings increased 8.0 percent or 38 cases from the same period of the previous year.

Chapter 11 filings decreased from 5 cases in the third quarter of 2022 to zero cases in the third quarter of 2023. In the first three quarters of 2023, Chapter 11 filings decreased to 3 cases from 7 cases in the same period of the previous year. Chapter 11 filings involve the structuring of repayment plans for companies.

Chapter 13 filings increased 11.4 percent or 10 cases in the third quarter of 2023, from the same quarter of 2022. In the first three quarters of 2023, Chapter 13 filings increased 15.3 percent or 37 cases from the same period of the previous year. Chapter 13 bankruptcy allows debtors to work out repayment arrangements with creditors.
