2/ Estimated. Also, no new information was available for the island of Hawaii so the 1998 figures were used as an estimate. In 1998, there were 263 Army personnel living in barracks on Johnston Island (which includes Kwajalein, Pago Pago and Alaska) and 64 Army personnel stationed in Hawaii and living in housing units, but with duty locations in Guam or foreign countries. These Army personnel are not included in the annual tables shown above and the figures for 1998 are listed in this footnote because no new information was available for 1999.

4/ The total number of navy military personnel is not sum to the total of personnel living in housing units, in barracks and aboard ship. This is because navy personnel assigned to ships on a specified date may also have another place to live elsewhere in Hawaii. Therefore, they may be counted more than once in the type of residence columns.
