Figures for "total resident population," "all civilians," and "civilian population - not military dependent" are based on population estimate revisions released in June 2019 and may differ somewhat from earlier figures cited in other tables.

2/ These figures are the estimates developed by the U.S. Census Bureau. They are based on the 2010 Census data and may differ somewhat from corresponding figures from the previous year's *Data Book* or from other sources.

3/ Dependents living in Hawaii, regardless of location of family head.

4/ The April 1, 2010 Population Estimate base was used for the April 1 figures. They reflect changes to the April 1, 2010 population due to the Count Resolution Program and the geographic program revisions.

5/ DBEDT estimate for the number of military dependents on April 1, 2010. The "not military dependents" figure on April 1, 2010 is the residual of this DBEDT estimated "military dependents" figure subtracted from the "all civilians" figure.
