It includes military personnel stationed or homeported in the area and residents temporarily absent, but excludes visitors present. Figures for "total resident population," "all civilians," and "civilian population - not military dependent" are based on population estimate revisions released in June 2022 and may differ somewhat from earlier figures cited in other tables. Data for 2010 through 2019 do not incorporate the results of the 2020 decennial census into their estimations.

2/ Calculated as the difference between "Total resident population" and "All civilians." Based on population estimate revisions released in June 2022 and may differ somewhat from earlier figures cited in other tables.

3/ Dependents living in Hawaii, regardless of location of family head. Based on the annual survey of local commanding officers, Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS) data, and DBEDT estimates.
