It includes military personnel stationed or homeported in the area and residents temporarily absent, but excludes visitors present. Population estimates were based on calculations by the Research & Economic Analysis Division of the Hawaii State Department of Business, Economic Development & Tourism, based on Census Bureau estimates. They may vary from previous versions of the *Data Book*.

2/ The de facto population is defined as the number of persons physically present in an area, regardless of military status or usual place of residence. It includes visitors present but excludes residents temporarily absent, both calculated as an average daily census. De facto population estimates may differ from earlier figures cited in other tables due to revised population estimates released during the year. As a result of revisions to the resident and de facto population figures, the de facto-resident ratio may also differ from earlier figures cited in other tables.
