MILITARY PERSONNEL

Although world conditions produce changes in the number of military personnel stationed in Hawaii, the total number of military personnel and their dependents has been over 105,000 for many years. The number of uniformed personnel stationed ashore or on ships homeported in Hawaii was more than 52,000 during the early 1960's but dropped to 49,700 in 1967 and 47,300 in January 1968.

All branches of the armed services are represented in Hawaii. The unified military command for the entire Pacific, CINCPAC, is located at Camp Smith, Oahu. The Navy, with 21,300 officers and men in Hawaii, has largest representation, followed by the Air Force with 10,600 the Army with 8,000 the Marine Corps with 6,000 and the Coast Guard with 1,500.

A central source of information on the number of military personnel and dependents in Hawaii is the Department of Planning and Economic Development which publishes a semi-annual report, Military Personnel and Dependents in Hawaii, based on information supplied by local commanding officers of the armed forces.

Department of Planning and Economic Development estimates differ somewhat from those published by the Bureau of the Census, Office of Business Economics and the Department of Defense primarily because of differences in definition. The Bureau of the Census and Department of Defense include personnel stationed on board ships only if they are actually in port on the date of the estimate. The Office of Business Economics omits all personnel on board ship. The Department of Planning and Economic Development includes personnel stationed on ships homeported in Hawaii.
