TAXES AND GOVERNMENT EXPENDITURES

Hawaii's tax structure has many features which provide a favorable tax climate for industry and investment. All major taxes are State administered and collected. There are no multiple local taxes, no personal property taxes, no special levies for school districts, etc. Real property tax rates, set by the county governments, are levied on a uniform statewide assessment ratio and administered under a statewide property reappraisal program.

Hawaii's per capita tax payment for state and local governments of \$412 in 1967 ranked second among the states. Hawaii also ranked second among the states for per capita tax measured as a percent of per capita income.

Information on taxes and tax collections in Hawaii can be obtained from the Department of Taxation. Publications of the Department of Taxation include the monthly and annual reports of Tax Base for Certain Taxes, Hawaii Income Patterns, and Outline of Hawaii's Tax System. The Department of Planning and Economic Development publishes a brief resume of the tax laws in Hawaii's Tax Climate.

Government expenditures and Federal grants are reported annually by the Department of Accounting and General Services, the Department of Budget and Finance, County auditors, and the U. S. Department of Commerce.

A convenient compilation of information on these subjects is the publication, <u>Government in Hawaii</u>, A Handbook of Financial Statistics, published annually by the Tax Foundation of Hawaii, a privately-supported, non-profit organization. This handbook compares Hawaii's expenditures, tax collections, certain government salaries and public indebtedness with those of the other states.
