EDUCATION

Hawaii has excellent schools and colleges which provide modern educational facilities from nursery school through the doctorate program at the University of Hawaii and post-doctoral programs at the East-West Center.

All public schools throughout the state are under the administration of the Department of Education. The Department of Education is responsible for the employment and assignment of teaching and administrative personnel, maintenance of standards and curriculum of all public schools, and the licensing of private schools.

Hawaii has the ninth largest public school system in the United States $\,$ under one school board.

Primary sources of information on education in Hawaii are the Research, Statistics and Data Processing Office and the Information Office of the Department of Education. The Department of Planning and Economic Development maintains information on the number of graduates in certain fields of work and publishes a brochure, <u>Hawaii's Educational Resources</u>, which describes public and private schools and colleges throughout the state.

Comparisons of Hawaii's educational costs, expenditures and other statistics with those of all the states are published annually by the National Education Association in their research report, Rankings of the States.
