SECTION 3

EDUCATION

This section presents statistics on school enrollment, graduates and degrees awarded, the highest grade of school completed, and school facilities, personnel, and expenditures.

Enrollment, in elementary, intermediate and high schools in 1969-1970 totalled 211,215, or almost double the 1940 figure. There were 216 public schools with 7,300 classroom teachers and 178,564 students (about 85 percent of the total). Some 28,000 full-time students and 29,000 part-time students attended colleges and universities in the State in 1969, chiefly on the Manoa Campus of the University of Hawaii.

Among adults, the illiteracy rate dropped from 35 percent in 1900 to 5.0 percent in 1960, and by 1967 approximately 23 percent of all Oahuans 25 years of age or more and 15 percent of all Neighbor Islanders in this age group could report having completed one or more years of college.

Section 4 of the Statistical Abstract of the United States: 1970 presents comparable data for the nation as a whole.
