## LAW ENFORCEMENT, COURTS, AND CORRECTIONS

Statistics in this section refer to crime and delinquency, the police, the judiciary system, prisons, and training schools.

Major offenses reported to the police in 1969 numbered 36,060, two and a half times as many as in 1959. The rate per 100,000 population has increased from 1,147 in 1939 to 4,778 in 1969. More than five-sixths of the 1969 total occurred on Oahu.

For the State as a whole, 18.2 percent of the major offenses and 67.6 percent of the minor offenses were cleared by arrest or otherwise. Seven-tenths of the persons arrested for major crimes and two-fifths of those arrested for lesser offenses were less than eighteen years of age. Well over half of the juveniles were counseled and released, and only a small number were committed to the State Youth Correctional Facility.

Inmates of the State correctional institutions averaged 348 during 1970, compared with 1,000 five decades earlier. The State Supreme Court, five Circuit Courts, and twenty-seven District Courts handled over 400,000 cases in 1970.

Statistics on law enforcement, courts, and corrections in Hawaii appear in the annual reports of the county police departments, the State Judiciary, and the Department of Social Services and Housing. National data are summarized in the *Statistical Abstract of the United States: 1970*, Section 5.
