SECTION 16

COMMUNICATIONS, POWER, AND SCIENCE

This section presents statistics relating to postal service, telephones, telegraphs, radio, television, newspapers, electrical and gas power and energy, and scientific resources.

Hawaii is served by all communications media. The most recent statistics indicate 80 post offices, 414,000 telephones, 29 radio stations, 10 commercial television stations, and seven daily newspapers.

Electricity sales exceeded 3.4 billion kilowatt-hours in 1969, or 6,577 per housing unit. Domestic gas sales totalled 34 million therms.

The State is also well served with scientific resources. A 1969 inventory reported 265 companies and agencies with research or scientific capabilities. Employment in these organizations was more than 20,000.

Information on communications, power and science can be obtained from reports and records of the U.S. Post Office Department, Federal Communications Commission, Hawaii State Public Utilities Commission, individual utility companies, and Audit Bureau of Circulations. Similar data for the nation as a whole can be found in the *Statistical Abstract* of the United States: 1970, Sections 18, 19, and 20.
