Section 3

EDUCATION

This section presents statistics on enrollment in public and private schools, colleges and universities; students graduated and degrees awarded; the highest grade of school completed; achievement test results; school facilities, personnel, and expenditures; and libraries.

Enrollment in elementary, intermediate and high schools in 1994-1995 totaled 219,224, compared with the previous all-time high of 216,000 reached in 1971-1972. There were 242 public schools with 11,602 classroom teachers and 183,795 students (83.8 percent of the total). There were also 132 private schools with 2,443 teachers and 35,429 pupils. Students graduating from public and private high schools in 1993-1994 numbered 12,307. Some 64,000 students attended colleges and universities in the State in Fall 1994, including 20,000 on the Manoa Campus of the University of Hawaii, 700 at UH-West Oahu, 2,900 at UH-Hilo, 27,800 at seven community colleges, and 12,400 in three private colleges and universities. The expenditure per pupil in public schools rose from \$2,701 in 1981-1982 to \$5,740 in 1993-1994. In scholastic aptitude tests, Hawaii students scored close to the national norms in the math component but considerably below in the verbal component. Among adults, an estimated 19 percent were functionally illiterate in English as of 1988. As of March 1993, almost one-fourth of all residents 25 years of age or more have completed four or more years of college. The Hawaii State Library System, with 49 locations on six islands, had 3.1 million books, 8,500 periodical subscriptions, 21,800 video tapes, and 110,000 sound recordings in 1994, with an annual circulation of 7.3 million. The University of Hawaii libraries in 1994 counted 3.4 million volumes.

The principal sources of data on education are the U.S. Bureau of the Census, Hawaii State Department of Education, University of Hawaii, and private colleges and universities. Historical Statistics of Hawaii, Section 9, contains Island data back to 1820. Section 4 of the Statistical Abstract of the United States: 1995 presents comparable information for the nation as a whole.
