Section 3 Education

This section presents statistics on school enrollment, the highest grade of school completed, school facilities and personnel, educational expenditures, and cultural activities. Sources for this information include the 1960 United States Census of Population, the Biennial Survey of Education conducted by the U. S. Office of Education, and reports of the Hawaii Department of Education. The Research and Statistics Branch of the latter agency can often provide more detailed data than appears in this summary. Section 4 of the <u>Statistical Abstract of the United States</u>: 1961 presents comparable information for the mainland.
