## Section 4 Law Enforcement

Statistics in this section refer to crime and delinquency, courts and prisons and training schools. Annual reports of the four county police departments, the State judiciary, and the State prison system provide most of the information on these subjects. Additional data can often be obtained from police and court personnel and the Division of Corrections of the State Department of Social Services. National statistics appear in the Statistical Abstract of the United States: 1961, Section 5.
